FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Human Life is Valuable

Every January for the past 38 years there has been a March For Life in Washington D.C. For the past 10 years or so, there have been regional marches as well. Although there will be a March this year, it will be far from what has been expected in the past. Why do so many people, estimated at close to 500,000 people any given year, make the sacrifice to make a pilgrimage to our nation's capital? It is a statement that life is valuable. This year it will be more important than ever to make a statement to our nation's leaders, as we will be losing one of the most powerful voices for life at the presidential level for one that has stated over and over his intention to disband and eliminate the laws and protections that have been put in place over the past four years.

As Catholic Christians, we believe each human life is valuable, unique and irreplaceable. Jesus Christ did not become man to save humanity, but to save each of us; from Adam and Eve to the last person conceived before he returns a second time. It is our belief that human dignity does not come from a government decree, a popular vote of a nation's population, a judge or a person's parent who decides to choose life; life is a gift God gives to each of us and is determined by Him. We hear this truth from the prophet Jeremiah: *Before you were born, I knew you.*

Although it is easy to see the value and dignity in a professional athlete, a popular politician, the rich or powerful; we claim an equal dignity for the poor, the marginalized, the sick, the elderly and even the unborn. All human persons are made in the image and likeness of God, and have dignity, period. Our dignity is not about what we might offer in a particular field; rather our dignity is part and parcel of who we are as children of God. It is difficult to see this dignity as it is physically invisible, but Christians see all things differently than the culture or the world.

The cultural worldview is that the things which make life worth living is the material wealth we attain through our jobs and the accomplishments that bring applaud and notoriety. Our culture says we need abortion because women can't find happiness if a baby gets in the way between them and their plans; women cannot climb the corporate success ladder if an unexpected child comes along; we need abortion to ensure all lives are loved and are wanted and we need euthanasia because a terminal illness takes away quality of life.

The Christian worldview is that what makes life worthwhile are love, generosity and self-sacrifice. This point of view changes the way we look at issues like abortion, euthanasia and embryonic stem cell research. Christ teaches we need the unborn child because no one can find happiness without learning how to sacrifice for another; he teaches we cannot get ahead by stepping on and sacrificing our brothers and sisters; he teaches that if we kill those we don't want, we abandon the heart of true love. Lastly, Christ teaches quality of life comes from accepting his love and mercy; something we can appreciate to a higher degree when we are sick, frail weak or elderly.

As our bishops have repeated again and again, the pro-life issue is the pre-eminent issue of our time. We are pro-life because this is a reflection of Christ's heart and ministry, a ministry filled with faith, hope and love. Christ chose to come into the world as an infant, with all the limitations this implied. He was totally dependent on others; he was powerless and born into a poor family; for a time, he was an unexpected, unborn child and as such speaks powerfully to our world today. Without speaking a word, he teaches us 'This is where love begins, and real power begins in love'. Loving the most inconsequential (according to the world) person, this is what being a Christian is all about.


