FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

MOTHER THERESA ON GOD'S THIRST FOR YOU:

Mother Teresa wrote a letter to her "spiritual family" dated March 25, 1993, asking the question, "Why does Jesus say "I Thirst"? What does it mean? "Something so hard to explain in words." Mother Teresa went on to write, "He thirsts for you. He loves you always, even when you don't feel worthy. When not accepted by others, even by yourself sometimes—He is the one who always accepts you." Mother Teresa continues, "The devil may try to use the hurts of life, and sometimes our own mistakes—to make you feel it is impossible that Jesus really loves you, is really cleaving to you. This is a danger for all of us. And so sad, because it is completely opposite of what Jesus is really wanting, waiting to tell you. Not only that He loves you, but even more—He longs for you. He misses you when you don't come close."

NEW YEAR'S RESOLUTIONS

I thought the above is a good guide for New Year's Resolutions, something we are all familiar with. When making resolutions, it is important to recall we are not only material beings, but spiritual as well. Getting into better shape, becoming better at organization, giving up a bad habit such as smoking or taking on a new hobby are all good things. But if this is the end of our resolution, we fail to address a critical truth of our being. It is not as if we are half material and half spiritual, we are fully both. This is why, for example, when we have a toothache, it is not just the tooth that is impacted. If I am in pain with a toothache, my patience, my attention span and my sunny disposition can all go down the drain. So don't give up on these resolutions, but pair them with a spiritual resolution as well. Below are some ideas to get you started. This is far from an all-encompassing list, just offered to help us think along these lines.

Reading sacred scripture: The Diocese of La Crosse has a plan in place to read the Bible through in a year's time. This is not as daunting as it might seem, but does require a plan, not just a desire. Using a journal Bible or gathering with some friends to read together or discuss what you are reading may keep us motivated. Reading it in a year's time might be an attainable goal, but there is nothing sacred about that time frame. Go at your pace, but have a pace.

Pray: Although reading Sacred Scripture can be prayer in itself, it is not necessarily so. Take some time to pray. Some good books on prayer or searching the internet on Catholic prayer and devotion may help. Another prayer for Catholic Christians is the daily Sacrifice of the Mass. Perhaps this is the year to add a daily Mass to your routine. If you cannot make it a weekly habit, consider once a month. As a side note, Pope Francis, in *Patris Corde*, has called for a year dedicated to St Joseph. The 19th of each month, in addition to the regular feast days of devotion to St Joseph, are set aside as special days for intercession and indulgences. Putting a reminder on your calendars now for the 19th of each month to attend Mass would be a great way to honor the foster father of our Lord throughout the coming year.

Listening to good music or reading inspirational books: It is so easy to slip into a routine rather than following an intentional program for our lives. One way to remain focused on the intentional drive is to reinforce this with quality music or inspirational reading. These take effort to find and attain the music or books in whatever media we like. They could be CD's or MP3"s, a hard copy of a book or kindle editions for all of the above. Again, it is the intention that is the motivating factor. So much more: These are simply some ways to start thinking on resolutions that will build the entire person, and is far from all-inclusive. Planning a family meal, getting a source of movies for the family, inviting a friend, neighbor or family member to come to Mass with you or discovering a new Saint or devotion to practice. Any of these and more can help the growth of our

spiritual side going along with our physical improvement.

I will close with a word of caution; pick only one or two areas to work on, as with the physical, overloading on the spiritual can be a cause of failing. Don't listen to the lies of Satan; we all fail at some point. He likes to make us feel total failures if we do follow through in spiritual matters, but that is not the case. When we grow physically, we stretch muscles, and may over-exert and end up with a strained muscle. We can get a strained spiritual muscle as well. The way to heal and strengthen this muscle is not to abandon the program, but perhaps a readjustment to the program may be required.
