#### **FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK**

1st WEEK OF LENT 2021

This Lent, we will take a look at the various aspects of the Mass, in addition to a few observations on some other practices we have as Catholics. On the heels of last week's testimonies and promotion for the practice of Adoration, we will begin with a bit of background on this sacred practice:

ADORATION: Why do we have Adoration in the Catholic Church? We believe that the bread and wine are substantially changed with the words of consecration into the body and blood, soul and divinity of Jesus Christ (Consubstantiation). We are blessed here at St John's to host the John Paul II Adoration chapel and offer 24 hour Adoration. Some of the other local parishes may occasionally have adoration for a time each week, monthly or other special occasions. These times of periodic adoration normally begin with separate liturgies for exposition and close with benediction. 24 hour adoration is a challenge, as we strive to never leave our Lord alone, so we have a schedule for adorers and subs. One question that comes up occasionally is 'I did not sign up, can I still participate?' Yes, anyone can stop in at any point, whether you have 5 minutes free or you want to spend an hour or more. The door to the chapel is open from 6:00 AM until 10:00 PM; please contact one of the directors if you wish to stop in later at night or early morning.

Now we will take a look at some aspects of the Mass. Hopefully these reflections will help gain a deeper appreciation for the Mass and our faith whether we are cradle Catholics, preparing to enter the Church at Easter or even if we are just thinking about entering. If you have friends or family that have left the practice of their faith, perhaps these can help them return home. God bless.

PROCESSION: Why do we have a procession to begin Mass? Wouldn't it be easier to just start from the sacristy? Yes, it would be more efficient, but the Mass is not about efficiency. It is about praise and worship; it is about celebrating an ancient liturgy in our world today. We gather in the church in anticipation. Christ, in the person of the priest, enters last, while all sing God's praises. This is similar to a royal procession, where everyone gathers and goes before the king until they are united around the throne. We gather around our eternal king, who is reigning from his throne; the cross and the altar of sacrifice. We also call to mind that we are on a pilgrimage through this life to heaven. The entrance procession, beginning at the back of the church (the world), is a symbol of that journey to heaven (the altar). Christ is our goal, symbolized by the altar, and he walks with us in the person of the priest.

More as we enter deeper into our Lenten journey.
