FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

ENTERING INTO HOLY WEEK

We will continue our look at the Mass following the Easter celebration, but first we will take a look at our Holy Week celebrations. The events of Holy Week changed the world and are, therefore, the holiest days of the year. The sacred liturgies observed during this week remember and make present again the passing of Jesus from life to death to new life—what is called the Paschal Mystery. Palm Sunday is the first day of Holy Week, which commences with the blessing of palms and the reading of the Passion of the Lord. This celebration celebrates the triumphant entrance of Jesus from Bethany to Jerusalem. Immediately afterwards, the theme of triumph changes radically with the reading of the Passion, which He endured for love of you.

Preparation Days: Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday of Holy Week are preparation days, both spiritually and physically, for the holiest days to come later in the week. In normal circumstances, the Chrism Mass would be celebrated during Holy week. This is when the sacred oils are blessed by the diocesan bishop for use throughout the diocese during the coming year.

Holy Thursday begins the Sacred Triduum - which means three days. These three days (Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Holy Saturday), liturgically are one celebration. We begin the Holy Thursday Mass with a Sign of the Cross, and this is not repeated until the opening of Holy Saturday Vigil. Likewise, there is no final blessing after the Mass of the Last Supper or the Good Friday service. The second day of the Sacred Triduum is the Passion of the Lord, known as Good Friday, the commemoration of the death of Jesus on the cross outside the walls of Jerusalem. The theme of this day throughout history has been one of quiet sorrow and mourning for the crucified and dead Jesus. Consider spending the hours of 12-3 p.m. in quiet prayer, giving up even a drink of water, in unity with Christ upon the cross. The emphasis of the liturgy on this solemn day is on Scripture readings and prayers, the veneration of the cross, and the reception of the Eucharist from the Hosts consecrated on Holy Thursday. (No Mass is celebrated throughout the world on Good Friday).

The daytime hours of Holy Saturday continue the atmosphere of Good Friday, and have been observed as s time of quiet and fasting. The Easter Vigil on the evening of Holy Saturday is the primary celebration of Jesus' Resurrection. The elaborate and beautiful ritual of the Easter Vigil has four clearly-defined parts: the service of light, the Liturgy of the Word, the celebration of the Sacraments of Initiation and the reception of the risen Christ in Holy Communion.

The service of light begins with a darkened church. The priest lights the new Paschal candle, the symbol of Christ's Resurrection. The Paschal candle is then used to light small candles held by those in the congregation as all process into the church to the chant of "light of Christ." The Exsultet and the readings recount the saving action of Christ and salvation history. Following the Gospel are the Sacraments of initiation when new members are brought into full communion with the Church and all the faithful recall their own baptisms. Then the Liturgy of the Eucharist is celebrated with the greatest of joy, leading to our reception of the risen Christ in Holy Communion.

This is a time to rejoice that the establishment of the Church and the celebration of the Sacraments are all made possible through the suffering, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. Holy Week concludes with Easter Sunday Masses continuing the celebrations of the triumphant joy of the Easter Vigil. It remembers and celebrates the very foundation of Christianity: Jesus, who is Lord, is raised from the dead. I encourage everyone to share in the incredible joy of Holy Week by participating, as much as possible, in the various celebrations during the week.
