ST ANNE AND MARY

In the first window on the west side of our church is an image of St. Anne and Mary. We all know who Mary is, the mother of Jesus, but perhaps we need to be reminded that she had a mom and dad as well. Although we do not have their names recorded in Sacred Scripture, there is ancient literature (Protoevangelium) that has identified them as St. Anne and St. Joachim.

The Church tradition teaches that their story is similar to that of Hannah and her husband, and the birth of Samuel. In fact the etymology of Hannah and Anne are the same, and mean 'favour' or 'grace'. It seems Anne and Joachim were childless until the birth of Mary. The Protoevangelium teaches that Joachim went to offer a sacrifice at the Temple, but was repulsed by a priest as he was childless, and such men were unworthy to be admitted to the Temple. In grief, Joachim went in solitude to the mountains to plead with God for a child. Anne, after learning the reason for her husband's long absence, cried to the Lord to take away the curse of sterility, promising to dedicate her child to the service of God. Their prayers were heard, and an angel was sent to Anne, saying "Hannah, the Lord has looked upon thy tears; thou shalt conceive and give birth and the fruit of thy womb shall be blessed by all the world" The same promise was made to Joachim, who then returned to his wife. The Church teaches that Mary was then conceived from this union without original sin, in preparation for her becoming the Mother of God.

VENERATION

In the East, the Greeks kept a feast of Anne and Joachim on September 9th, and even the image we have of St. Anne, painted in the 8th century, owes it origin to Byzantine influence. In the west, except for southern France, it was not until the thirteenth century that we find an official feast in honor of St. Anne. The devotion to St. Anne spread slowly in the Latin Church, but it was not officially extended universally until 1854.

In the popular image of St. Anne, she is holding Mary as a child, and often Mary is holding the child Jesus. In our window image, Mary is holding a scroll of Sacred Scripture as an image of the Word of God that became man. There are many shrines devoted to St. Anne across Europe, but the most famous one in America is in Quebec City, Quebec, Canada, the Shrine of St. Anne de Beaupre (If you get the opportunity to travel to this part of Canada, it is well worth a side trip to visit this Shrine). St. Anne is patroness of the province of Quebec, as it was settled to a large extent by the French, who brought this devotion with them. When the site of the shrine was dedicated on March 13, 1658 by the missionary priest Fr. Vignal, St Anne showed her favor through the healing of Louis Guimont, an inhabitant of Beaupre, who suffered terribly from rheumatism of the loins. Full of confidence in St. Anne, he came forward and placed three stones in the foundation of the new building, whereupon he found himself suddenly and completely cured. This first authentic miracle was the precursor of countless graces and miracles at the site, as St. Anne has continued to lavish her kindness on pilgrims that come to the shrine each year imploring her help. This is testified to by huge mounds of crutches, bandages, walking-sticks and other appliances left behind by cripples, lame and sick persons who have made a pilgrimage to the shrine and have returned home healed. St. Anne is patroness of women in labor and miners, with Christ being compared to gold and Mary to silver. In addition, along with Joachim, they are patron saints of grandparents.
