FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

MEET THE SAINTS

As we continue meeting the saints that adorn the windows of our beautiful church, the next window holds a depiction of St. Teresa of Avila. St. Teresa of Ávila, also called Saint Teresa of Jesus, (born March 28, 1515, Ávila, Spain—died October 4, 1582, feast day October 15), She is one of the great mystics and religious women of the Roman Catholic Church, and author of spiritual classics. She was the originator the Carmelite Reform, which restored and emphasized the austerity and contemplative character of primitive Carmelite life. Teresa was born into a wealthy, although pious, family. In her youth, she cared mostly about boys, cloths, flirting and rebellion. At 16 she was sent to a convent because her father thought she was out of control. Hating this at first, Teresa eventually grew to love this life. Teresa was torn between the desire for religious life and married life. It was after her mother died in 1529, and, despite her father's opposition, Teresa entered the Carmelite Convent of the Incarnation at Ávila, Spain.

Teresa was a woman "for God," a woman of prayer, discipline, and compassion. Her heart belonged to God. Her ongoing conversion was an arduous lifelong struggle, involving ongoing purification and suffering. She was misunderstood, misjudged, and opposed in her efforts at reform. She struggled with her own mediocrity, her illness and her opposition. In the midst of all this she clung to God in life and in prayer. Her writings on prayer and contemplation, drawn from her experience, are powerful, practical, and graceful.

Teresa was a woman "for others." Though a contemplative, she spent much of her time and energy seeking to reform herself and the Carmelites, to lead them back to the full observance of the primitive Rule. She founded many new monasteries. She traveled, wrote, fought—always to renew, to reform. In all the people she touched, she was a woman for others, a woman who inspired and gave life.

Shortly after joining the convent, Teresa became very seriously ill, and her health remained permanently impaired. During these years of suffering she began the practice of mental prayer. Teresa's ascetic doctrine has been accepted as the classical exposition of the contemplative life, and her spiritual writings are among the most widely read. Her Life of the Mother Teresa of Jesus (1611) is autobiographical; the Book of the Foundations (1610) describes the establishment of her convents. Her recognized written masterpieces on the progress of the Christian soul toward God through prayer and contemplation are The Way of Perfection (1583), The Interior Castle (1588), Spiritual Relations, Exclamations of the Soul to God (1588), and Conceptions on the Love of God. She experienced such extraordinary manifestations as the piercing of her heart, the spiritual espousals and the mystical marriage. A vision of the place destined for her in hell in case she should have been unfaithful to grace, determined her to seek a more perfect life.

Her reforms of the Religious, both men and women, faced persecutions during her life, but were officially established on June 22, 1580. St Teresa was called home on Oct 4, 1582. She was beatified in 1614 and canonized in 1622 by Gregory XV. Her remains are preserved incorrupt in Alba, Spain. St. Teresa's position among writers on mystical theology is unique. In all her writings on this subject she deals with her personal experiences, which a deep insight and analytical gifts enabled her to explain clearly. She herself had no pretension to found a school in the accepted sense of the term. She is intensely personal, her system going exactly as far as her experiences, but not a step further.

In 1970, the Church gave her the title she had long held in the popular mind: Doctor of the Church (She and St. Catherine of Siena were the first women so honored). St Teresa is the Patroness of Spain, sick people, people in religious orders and people ridiculed for their piety.
