#### **FIRST HOLY COMMUNION**

This Sunday we celebrate First Holy Communion in the city of Marshfield. All 3 parishes will be offering this sacrament to the children of the various parishes. We are blessed to have 28 children receiving the sacrament here at St. John the Baptist. We have been preparing these children to receive the Lord in the sacrament of Holy Communion, most recently through receiving the sacrament of Reconciliation or Penance as it is also called. Both of these are offered around the age of reason, which is around 7 years of age, which normally corresponds to 2<sup>nd</sup> grade in school. This is a sacrament that is always a joy to be a part of, especially as a priest. The reactions of the children can never be anticipated, as Art Linkletter once noted in his book, 'Kids say the Darndest Things' and this holds true as they prepare for these two sacraments. It is always a great reminder of how we are called to become like little children, and their openness and honesty in all things help us appreciate the simple truth of God's love for His children no matter how old we might be.

#### HAPPY MOTHER'S DAY

Today's age has been called the 'cult of personality'. We see this in our political life, our sports world and even in many aspect of church life. All the attention comes to the individual rather than on the team or larger picture of what is being discussed. Very little substance is offered regarding the issues, rather some cliché's are offered or a personal attack is made against our opponent.

How different this is when compared to our Mother, whom we celebrate during this month of May. Mary was visited by an angel, who told her that she had been chosen to be the Mother of God. What was her response? To run to the media of the day, promote herself as the model of womanhood? To demand that others recognize her elevated status?
