The Diocese of La Crosse, through its policies and procedures, seeks to provide a prompt, appropriate and compassionate response to reporters of sexual abuse of a child by any diocesan agent (bishop, priest, deacon, employee, religious, vendor or volunteer). Anyone wishing to make a report of an allegation of sexual abuse should send that report to Mrs. Teresa Brown, Complaint Intake Agent, at the Diocese of La Crosse, P.O. Box 4004. La Crosse. WI 54602-4004. Alternatively, you can contact Mrs. Brown at 608.791.0179 or intakeagent@diolc.org. The reporting form is available through the Diocese of La Crosse Office of Safe Environment or on the diocesan website at: diolc.org/ safeenvironment/reporting. Individuals are also encouraged to take their reports directly to civil authorities. Copies of the diocesan policy are available through your local Parish and on the diocesan website. FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

MEET THE SAINTS- ST. JOSEPH

The next image we have in our church is an image of St. Joseph, husband of Mary and foster father of Jesus. St. Joseph is a man of mystery in Sacred Scripture as we have recorded a total of zero words he spoke in this life. But this does not mean we know nothing about him, as there are books and books written about him. This is also a good time to come to know more about St. Joseph, as Pope Francis has named this the Year of St Joseph, a year of special devotions and study so we may know more about St. Joseph in order to know and love him at a deeper level.

We do not know much about Joseph before he appears betrothed to Mary. We do know he was a carpenter, and was entrusted to caring for the material needs of the child Jesus and his mother, Mary. In doing these fatherly duties, he is the one we turn to as fathers, both physical and spiritual fathers in the world.

In the Church, we celebrate two major solemnities devoted to St. Joseph. On March 19th we celebrate St. Joseph, Husband of Mary as a solemnity and on May 1st, a more recent solemnity of St. Joseph the Worker. (This feast is of particular importance in the diocese of La Crosse, as our Cathedral in La Crosse is entrusted to St. Joseph under this title).

In Sacred Scripture, various encounters are recorded between Joseph and the Archangel Gabriel, each of which led Joseph to take drastic action. This first was after an obviously pregnant Mary returned after 3 months visiting her cousin Elizabeth. It was Joseph's intention to quietly divorce Mary, but was told by Gabriel to be not afraid to take Mary into his home. In faith, he followed the word of Gabriel, taking Mary into his home. Although not a recorded encounter, Joseph witnessed the shepherds at the crib of the baby Jesus following their encounter. He would know well the awesomeness of what the shepherds described, and would undoubtedly have been in awe at their sudden appearance and their story of the choir of angels announcing the birth of Jesus.

Later he would be instructed by the angel Gabriel to flee to Egypt, taking Mary and the newborn infant in order to protect his life from Herod. In this event, Joseph immediately gets up and begins their escape in the middle of the night. Although we do not know how long the Holy Family remained in Egypt, upon Herod's death he was instructed to return with the child and his mother to their homeland.

The last time we encounter Joseph in Sacred Scripture is when the child is lost for 3 days in the Temple. When they find him, Mary asks 'Why have you done this? Did you not know your father and I have been searching for you? Following this, it is recorded that Jesus returned home and was obedient to them as he grew in faith and wisdom. Although we do not have details of the events during this time, or even how long Joseph remained in this world, we do know Jesus spent much time learning the trade of carpentry at the feet of Joseph, because at one point it was asked "Who is this? Is he not the carpenter's son?"

St Joseph is mentioned at other moments of Sacred Scripture, although we do not know where or when he passed from this world. There are many apocryphal stories and books on his life, as well as many current popular devotions that tell us a bit more about this great saint. He is patron of the universal church and of workers, fathers and homes (he is credited with selling homes).

St. Joseph Pray for us!
