

#### **MEMORIAL DAY**

As we prepare for Memorial Day celebrations this year, it is good to recall that this is more than the unofficial start to the summer season. For all Americans, Memorial Day is a special time to remember all those that have died in the service to our nation and freedom, including soldiers, police officers and firefighters. In addition, for Catholic Christians there is something more as well. This is a great time to reflect on the meaning of human freedom, the source of our freedoms and to offer thanks to God for the Church which proclaims the way to the fullness of freedom. Freedom is not a possession of the government, local, state or national; a possession that those in charge can extend or retract as they desire. We are living in a time that this has become how many in government are acting, and it is obvious that this is a path to destruction in all aspects of our lives. This understanding of freedom has a special meaning as we come out of over a year of disruption in every aspect of our lives, as our freedoms have been curtailed, and we have allowed them to be. This has impacted the entirety of our lives and society from our health to our businesses, our schools and our faith lives.

In our world today there is a distorted meaning to freedom. The Catechism of the Catholic Church helps us gain a fuller understanding of true freedom. "The more one does what is good, the freer one becomes. There is no true freedom except in the service of what is good and just. The choice to disobey and do evil is an abuse of freedom and leads to "the slavery of sin." Freedom makes man responsible for his acts to the extent that they are voluntary. Progress in virtue and knowledge of the good enhance the mastery of the will over its acts." (See, CCC #1731-1734)

The Church teaches there are two aspects to our freedom; our nature and the purpose of humanity. We are more than material beings; we are body and soul, made in the image and likeness of God, endowed with free will and reason. The perfection of any created thing is the ability to fully act according to its nature. Not being able to do so is to be lacking in a good and results in a loss of freedom.

Scott Hahn speaks of the nature of a thing in terms of something we are very familiar with; trains. It is their nature to run on tracks, and as long as it remains on the tracks, people and goods can be delivered to their destinations in a timely manner. What if the train decided the tracks were impeding its freedom? A derailment is not an issue of a train gaining freedom, but results in a kind of slavery of being off the tracks. Acting according to our nature allows us to be all we can be.

In The Gospel of Life St. Pope John Paul II looks at freedom and the purpose of humanity. He writes that when freedom is no longer based on objective truth, it destroys itself. He says since freedom is inherently relational, if the self is understood in terms of absolute autonomy, as it is in secular society, then people will eventually reject each other as each person seeks to have their interests prevail. Thus, society becomes a mass of competing individuals without mutual bonds. Such a society does not become more free; it becomes less free as vice, corruption, brutality, and oppression inevitably increase.

These examples show that the need for freedom is imprinted in our very nature, and for that reason men and women throughout history have been willing to make even the ultimate sacrifice to attain or retain freedom. Our Creator instilled this into our very nature in order that we might seek Him to the best of our ability, and it is the obligation of the state to ensure its citizens are free to exercise this freedom. If the state fails in this obligation, at some point human beings will rightly fight and die for true freedom.
