PARISH PULL 2021

After a year of cancelled community events, we are pleased to announce that the Parish Pull will again be held this year at the Marshfield Fairgrounds on July 9th. This annual pull is a much anticipated event in the Marshfield area as a fundraiser for various civic groups as well as for the churches involved. Please consider volunteering for this event, as many man-hours are required for such things to be a success.

The vision of Fr. Sam and the initial organizers of the Parish Pull was to host an event that was more concentrated on getting the community together for a fun filled, family orientated summer evening. The hope was that the local parishes would come together as a community with funds raised going to help various civic groups that might be ordinarily outside the purview of parish business as normal. This has been a successful venture, as we have given out just under \$150,000 over the course of 7 years.

There will be a volunteer drive at the Masses over the coming weekends at all sponsoring parishes. This is an opportunity for all of us to join with our friends and neighbors from neighboring parishes to create something special and unique right here in our town. Please consider volunteering for this service. There will be many options, including specific times or jobs that need to be accomplished. In addition to the work that needs to be completed that evening, there is a cleanup crew that is needed the following day. Yes, much of this is behind the scenes work, and often a thankless task. However, as with any successful endeavor, this is where the success or failure of the operation is captured. Many hands make light work. Speaking with volunteers over the years, this is where so many connections and great friendships are formed. Volunteering for these duties draw us out of ourselves and are an opportunity to serve others in ways we do not come across in the normal course of events in daily life, and I do not believe I have ever had anyone express regret over becoming involved.
