### FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

#### MEET THE SAINTS - ST. FRANCIS OF ASSISI

St. Francis is undoubtedly one of the most well known of our saints, and there is much that could be written. We will have to do with an introduction, and a few highlights of his life. Francis's father was a textile merchant, and was very wealthy. Francis was being groomed to take over the family business, and his youth was spent in the company of other wealthy men and women of Assisi. He was more interested in the trappings of wealth and youth than anything else, including the family business. Around the age of 20 he became involved in a skirmish between Assisi and the Perugians, and was taken captive, being held for over a year. It was during this time he first began to think of things of eternity, although the thought of being a great knight was never far from his mind.

Setting aside the trappings of wealth, he began embracing poverty. Shortly after this, one day he came across a leper in his travels. Being naturally repulsed, he got off his horse and embraced the man, giving him all the money ha had on him. Shortly after this, Francis embarked on a pilgrimage to Rome where his conversion deepened. Upon returning to Assisi, one day he was in a chapel and he heard the voice of the Lord; 'Francis, repair my house'. Thinking he meant the little chapel he was sitting in, Francis set about rebuilding the physical structure of that chapel. As Francis grew into his vocation, he had many fights with his father, even being imprisoned for a time. Despite the opposition he faced, he continued, and eventually formed a group of mendicants, or beggars, that would eventually become what we know as Franciscans. His example of poverty drew others to him, and soon a small group was seen around Assisi and other parts of Italy.

Francis came to Rome, and after first being rejected by Pope Innocent III, was accepted and was given authority to preach throughout Europe. It was at this time they changed their name to Friars Minor. Shortly after this (1212) a wealthy heiress named Clare heard Francis preaching, and was so moved she gave up her wealth and position to follow Francis, eventually founding the Poor Clare's, an order that remains in existence today. During the late teens of the thirteenth century, Francis took part in the 5<sup>th</sup> Crusade, even meeting with the leader of the Muslim troops. It was also at this time the Franciscans were given charge of the Holy Places in Jerusalem, which they serve to this day.

Toward the end of his life, Francis had a vision on the Feast of the Exaltation of the Cross, which resulted in his receiving the stigmata (physical wounds of Christ on his body). Brother Leo witnessed this event, and saw a vision of a Seraph, a six winged angel on a cross. The angel gave him the gift of the five wounds of Christ. Francis died on Oct 3 1226, and was pronounced a saint By Pope Gregory IX in 1228.

Francis set out to imitate Christ and literally carry out his work. This is important in understanding Francis' character, his affinity for the Eucharist and respect for the priests who carried out the sacrament. He preached: "Your God is of your flesh, He lives in your nearest neighbor, in every man." Poverty, both personal and corporate, was central to his order. He also believed nature was the image of God, and called all creatures 'brother and sister', preaching to birds and even persuading a wolf in Gubbio to stop attacking local citizens if they agreed to feed him. It was near Assisi, around the year 1220 that Francis set up the first Christmas scene, or crèche. His nativity used animals to create a living scene so worshipers could contemplate the birth of Christ in a direct way, using all the senses.

Francis is the patron of Italy, animals, merchants and the ecology.
