BACK TO SCHOOL

Once again, we are preparing for the kids to return to school. Each fall brings with it a new school year, new opportunities, new challenges, new classes, new teachers; the list could go on and on. Most of all, it is a time for new beginnings, and that is exciting, and although we are not 100% back to normal, we are edging closer. It is said we do not have a Church with a mission, rather we have a mission that has a Church. Educating our future generations is one of the most important aspects of our mission, and encouraging and passing on the faith to future generations is an obligation of every confirmed Catholic.

Here in the Marshfield area, Columbus Catholic is experiencing a growth in enrollment, and the St. John's building is filled to capacity as we begin the new school year, which is a very good problem to have. The school Masses will be open to parents as we begin the school year if they are able to join us. FAMILY FAITH FORMATION

In order to serve our families that have chosen the public school or in some cases to home school, we are continuing with the family faith formation program which we began last year. There have been a couple tweaks to the program, and we are hoping these will help our families grow in the knowledge and practice of the faith. These changes have been outlined in a letter parents should have received by now (parents of children grades 1 - 10; if you have not received the information, please contact the director of faith formation). All parents are expected to see their child is either enrolled in the Catholic School or in the Family Faith Formation program.

We will continue basing our Faith Formation on the liturgical cycle. September marks the beginning of our program for the year, with once a month class for the students, with an additional meeting for the middle school grades. This second class will be aimed at how we live our faith, and the coordinator is planning a variety of activities to help broaden the faith experience of our middle school grades.

Our program uses the family based model, with the older children helping the parents in passing on the faith to younger children by having all focus on one theme, but with a variety of topics and lessons according to grade level. Each grade level will be expected to continue growing in their faith life, and develop a greater base of prayers and knowledge appropriate for each grade level, as well as a deeper experience of Jesus Christ in their lives. The second grade will continue preparing for the reception of 1st Reconciliation and 1st Eucharist, with the 9th and 10th grade levels preparing to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation.

In this time of great uncertainty in so many areas of our lives, we can form a greater level of certainty in our faith lives. With a faith built upon a firm foundation, we will weather the many storms of life. Thank you for your commitment to Catholic education in all forms. With your continued support, Catholic education will remain a stabilizing factor in the lives of our young people for years to come.
