KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS FAMILY OF THE YEAR Ray and Pam Housworth Family

Congratulations to the Ray and Pam Housworth family for being chosen as the 2021 Knights of Columbus Wisconsin Family of the year. One family each year is selected by the State Board of the K of C as a special recognition for a family that serves in many areas connected with the Knights of Columbus. This is a special acknowledgment for the Knights in the Diocese of La Crosse, as this is the second consecutive year this has been awarded to a family from our diocese.

Family and respect for life are hallmarks of the K of C organization. This fraternal organization was started in the United States by Blessed Michael McGivney, a diocesan priest from Hartford, CN, during the industrial revolution in order to support families that lost the father, through insurance policies. The insurance and investments of the Knights continues to benefit the many families that take part in these programs. However, the purpose of the Knights goes beyond this, and as a group they form one of the largest fraternal organizations in the Church. The Knights come from all backgrounds in the Church; single, married and clergy, and have something to offer to all Catholic men and their families. These are often one of the first connections priests turn to when we are in need of assistance at the parish level. The Knights serve those that are handicapped through things such as the tootsie roll drive and service to the unborn through the life saver campaign. Locally, they are instrumental in many activities (one of which we just completed, the Parish Pull), Eucharistic Adoration and the Corpus Christi procession to name a few. I would encourage any men not already a Knight to prayerfully consider joining, and if you are already a Knight, but find yourself too occupied to be involved, commit for a year to attend the meetings (first Thursday of the month at the Columbia Room at St John's school) and offer your services to one of the K of C activities. See for yourself how enriching this can be in your faith life. One of the more recent ministries of the Knights is to serve as a resource for families, with an emphasis on fathers as spiritual fathers in the home. offer or how to become involved, check out this web site. Originally we were set up to have Bishop Callahan joining us for this celebration, but health matters have prevented this from occurring.
