#### FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

#### A RIGHT AND A DUTY TO DEFEND OURSELVES

As we prepare to celebrate the 4<sup>th</sup> of July, our national holiday of Independence, it is a great time to recall the most basic freedoms we hold to as a nation. In fact, even as so much of our world is eroded through protests and similar events taking place, even these are due to the fact that we live in a free nation. Try doing these things even today in Russia, China or any other nation operating under a socialist or communist regime, and you will find they are not tolerated by the authorities. These attacks are against not only some of our dearest held civic freedoms, they go to the heart of what we hold to as Catholic Christians. Additionally, as we come out of a year where our most basic freedom such as the right to freely associate and the right to freely worship, our nation and our Church are in a dangerous position where the rights of all people of faith have turned over to the government our most cherished rights. Speak with persons that have lived through such times in other nations, and one thing that becomes apparent is once these have been given up, it is very difficult to reclaim them.

So we see the Catholic Church has not only the right to defend herself, she also has a duty to do this and to speak the truth. Because we speak the Truth, this is not only a defense of the Church, but it is a defense of all society. This is something that came to the forefront at the recent spring USCCB meeting, when a hot topic of discussion was whether or not to pursue creating a document on the Eucharist. From reading secular reports, this was boiled down to the question on if Catholics in public office could openly disagree with fundamental Church teachings and receive Communion at the same time. We hear often that the Church should "stay out of politics," especially at election time. But evidently some think it's just fine for politicians to infiltrate and undermine the Church. Why is it OK for a politician to claim to be a 'devout Catholic' and at the same time publically attack fundamental Church teachings? These public officials do not take a neutral position, but do all within their sphere of influence and power to destroy these teachings of the Church they claim to adhere to. There are others that have been instrumental in setting up groups such as Catholics in Alliance for the Common Good, Catholics United or other such organizations that are anything but Catholic in their worldview.

The heart of this issue goes to the heart. As Catholic Christians, what do we truly believe concerning the Holy Eucharist? At their recent meeting, it was reported that the bishops would be discussing a document barring certain politicians from receiving Communion. However, this is an oversimplification of a very complex issue. While I am sure this topic will be addressed, the principal topic will be a discussion on what we as Catholics believe concerning the Eucharist and how this impacts our everyday life, no matter what our position is in society. This document will also be a teaching tool that will be at the center of a Eucharistic Congress to be held in the United States in 2022 (initial proposed dates). It is my opinion that a well thought out document will help all Catholics grow in their understanding of the Real Presence in the Eucharist, and the implications that this will mean in the entirety of our lives; how we catechize others, what we do in our work lives, our schools, our family lives, in our political lives, even in our leisure and who we choose to spend time with. There is nothing outside of Jesus' desire to be a part of in the life of his brothers and sisters, sons and daughters of a God who is love.

We will stay tuned to the USCCB for further developments on a Eucharistic Congress, but it will be good to begin today preparing our hearts to be open to the teachings that will be forthcoming. In addition, we are so blessed in the deanery of Marshfield to have the St. John Paul II Adoration chapel available 24 / 7 for personal growth and devotion.

The reporting form is available through the Diocese of La Crosse Office of Safe Environment or on the diocesan website at: diolc.org/safe environment/reporting.
