FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

ARCHBISHOP FULTON SHEEN WARNS OF A CRISIS IN CHRISTENDOM

I recently came across an article on Archbishop Fulton Sheen on a coming crisis in Christendom; written in 1974 he warned Christendom, an economic, political and social life inspired by Christian principles, was coming to an end. The breakup of the family, divorce, abortion, immorality, general dishonesty (today we can add gender confusion, the sexual abuse crisis and CRT to this list) is all indicative of this. He reminds us this is not the end of the Church, but Christendom. It seems to me this is a time to reflect on his warning. If this was true in 1974, it is more apparent today.

He reminded his audience that of 22 civilizations that have decayed since the beginning of the world, 19 rotted and perished from within. Living in it day to day, it is difficult to see the decay; we get accustomed to the way things are and take them as normal. Today how much of our press, our music, our movies or television are inspired by Christian principals? And yet, we continually invite them into our living rooms, schools and workplaces. We are afraid of being unpopular or un-woke, so we go along to get along.

Archbishop Sheen noted the Church has a history of rising and falling, as Christ himself did on the road to Calvary. He teaches the first fall came was around the year 500 when Rome fell. In the midst of this time, great saints such as Augustine and Patrick arose to spread the faith. A second fall came around the year 1000 with the Moslem invasion and the schism of the East and West. Rising again, a third fall came during the Reformation, when many priests and nuns defected from their vows. Reformers began trying to reform the faith, but there was nothing wrong with the faith but in how it was being lived. A moral reformation was needed then, as it is today.

According to Sheen (writing in 1974) we are now in the 4th period, and we are falling again. He writes that in each of the 500 year times frames, the Church's enemies had specific focus. During the first period, the attacks were on the doctrine centering on the person of Christ; then there were attacks on the head of the church, followed by attacks on the Body of Christ, the Mystical Body in the Church. Today we face attacks from the spirit of the world. We are called to conform to the world, or we are branded as enemies. But the Lord says: 'I have taken you out of the world.' We want to win the world, but Jesus tells us: 'I pray not for the world'. Sheen recalls the wisdom of Vatican II that calls us to go into the world, but not to be the world.

For Sheen, this is a great time to be alive. It is no longer easy to be a Christian in the world during these days of testing; the world and society no longer friendly to Christianity. It is time to remove the masks (from 45 years ago) and reveal to the world and to ourselves who we really are. "Today the current is against us. And today the mood of the world is, 'Go with the world, go with the spirit.' Listen, dead bodies float downstream. Only live bodies resist the current. And so the good Lord is testing us." He teaches this is very similar to the test the Jews had during the Exodus and we have the opportunity to show who we truly are

So, does he have an answer to the trials of our day? Yes, and we will discuss that in next week's article.


