#### **FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK**

#### **MEET THE SAINTS - ST. LOUIS IX**

I am not quite sure what to make of the stained glass window over the title of St. Louis. The dress seems more indicative of St. John the Baptist, but as he is depicted with many images within our church, as it should be in a church under his patronage, I will offer what I found concerning St. Louis IX, as he is the most famous of the various St. Louis's I was able to research. Louis IX was born in Poissy, France in 1215. He was only 11 years of age when his father died, making him king at a very early age, and is normally portrayed in royal garments. At 19 he married Marguerite of Provence, and into this family was born 11 children.

St. Louis was concerned with the relationship between the state and Christianity, and did much to further Christianity in France. He was also aware of the Muslim problem in the Holy Land, including the Muslims invading the city of Jerusalem, undertaking and leading crusades in 1248-49 and in 1270. He also sought to improve relations between France and England to prevent new conflicts between these two nations. St. Louis proved to have been above all a lover of peace, a king who desired not only to put an end to conflicts, but also to remove the causes for fresh wars, and this spirit of peace rested upon the Christian conception.

In his relations with various popes, St. Louis was able to protect the clergy of France from encroachments or molestations of barons and royal officers, as well as protecting them when the 'Hungarian Master', who was in league with Muslims, sought to plunder them. St. Louis was a great lover of justice, and organized the 'court of the King' into a regular court.

St. Louis led an exemplary life, bearing constantly in mind his mother's words: "I would rather see you dead at my feet than guilty of a mortal sin." His biographers have told us of the long hours he spent in prayer, fasting, and penance, without the knowledge of his subjects. He was also a patron of architecture. The Sainte Chappelle, an architectural gem, was constructed in his reign, and it was under his patronage that Robert of Sorbonne founded the "Collège de la Sorbonne," which became the seat of the theological faculty of Paris.

He was renowned for his charity. The peace and blessings of the realm come to us through the poor he would say. Beggars were fed from his table, he ate their leavings, washed their feet, ministered to the wants of the lepers, and daily fed over one hundred poor. He founded many hospitals and houses: the House of the Felles-Dieu for reformed prostitutes; the Quinze-Vingt for 300 blind men (1254), hospitals at Pontoise, Vernon, Compiégne.

The Enseignements (written instructions) which he left to his son Philip and to his daughter Isabel, the discourses preserved by the witnesses at judicial investigations preparatory to his canonization show St. Louis to have been a man of sound common sense, possessing indefatigable energy, graciously kind and of playful humor, and constantly guarding against the temptation to be imperious. St. Louis, through his personal qualities as well as his saintliness, increased for many centuries the prestige of the French monarchy. St. Louis's canonization was proclaimed at Orvieto in 1297, by Boniface VIII.


