FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

OCTOBER, MARY'S MONTH

During this month of October which is dedicated to Our Blessed Mother, we will reflect on the pivotal role Mary has in our faith lives. This week, we will see some quotations and reflections of St. John Vianney, Patron Saint for priests, on our Blessed Mother:

- "Avarice is an inordinate love of riches and the good things of this life. Jesus Christ, to cure us of it, was born in extreme poverty, deprived of all comforts. He chose a Mother who was poor. He willed to pass as the Son of a humble workman."
- "Happy is he who lives and dies under the protection of the Blessed Virgin."
- "I LOVE St. Joseph so much because he had the care of the Blessed Virgin."
- "Humility is like a pair of scales: the lower one side falls, the higher rises the other. Let us humble ourselves like the Blessed Virgin and we shall be exalted."
- "Let us live as the Blessed Virgin lived: loving God only, desiring God only, trying to please God only in all that we do."
- "The Blessed Virgin is like a good mother who, not content with looking after all her children in general, watches over each one separately."
- "Jesus on the Cross said to the disciple whom He loved: "Behold your Mother!" How sweet are those words to the Christian who is able to understand what depths of love they contain!"
- "JESUS CHRIST, after having given us all He could give, that is to say, the merit of his toils, His sufferings, and His bitter death; after having given us His Adorable Body and Blood to be the Food of our souls, willed also to give us the most precious thing He had left, which as His holy Mother."
- "The Blessed Virgin's life was full of sorrow...Every time her tender glance fell upon her Divine Son, she suffered..."
- "It is impossible to meditate with devotion upon the Mysteries of the Rosary and live in a state of sin."
