#### **ANNUAL APPEAL**

As I mentioned at the Masses last weekend, you should have received a mailing from the diocese this past week. If you have not received a letter by mid-week, please contact the parish office, and we can get the material to you.

How is an appeal measured for success? I believe it begins with the percentage of families that respond to the appeal mailing. This is where everyone is able to participate spiritually if not financially, and it is the spiritual that is the central, foundational rock of a successful appeal. If we would receive only 25% of the responses and attain our goal, in my judgment, this would be a failed campaign. Here at St John's, we annually average around 40% to 45% of the appeal commitment cards returned. I have been associated with parishes that have attained right at 100% of the cards that went out were returned, and I have seen some as low as the 20% to 25% participation. This year, we are concentrating our efforts on getting the appeal response to over 50% participation. Reaching 60% or even 70%, in my opinion, is an attainable goal. Taking the effort to fill the card out and returning it is a concrete statement that you will commit this to prayer, and when the spiritual ends are attained, the financial aspect will follow.

We need to be aware that the curial staff itself has no independent source of funding, and is reliant on the support of the parishes throughout the diocese. When praying about this appeal, please pray for the overall success of the appeal, not just the success of the appeal in our parish. We are but a small percentage of the overall appeal, and we need to support the entire appeal spiritually.

#### **OCTOBER REFLECTION:** ST JOHN PAUL II AND OUR BLESSED MOTHER

"Consecrating the world to the Immaculate Heart of the Mother means returning beneath the cross of the Son. It means consecrating this world to the pierced heart of the Savior, bringing it back to the very source of its redemption. Redemption is always greater than man's sin and the 'sin of the world.' The power of Redemption is infinitely superior to the whole range of evil in man and the world. The heart of Mary is aware of this, more than any other heart in the whole universe, visible, and invisible. And so she calls us.
