FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

ALL SAINTS DAY AND ALL SOULS DAY

Eternal Rest Grant Unto Them O Lord, and Let Perpetual Light Shine Upon Them.

Although this year All Saints Day falls on a Monday, and thus is not a Holy Day of Obligation, it does remain a Solemnity Feast in the eyes of the Church. The bishops in the United States have removed the obligatory aspect of certain solemnities when they fall on a Monday or a Saturday, with the exceptions being The Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception (Dec. 8) and Christmas, which will be played out this December 25th, as it falls on a Saturday. For the Solemnity of Christmas, we will offer Christmas Eve Masses on Friday, Christmas Day Masses on Saturday morning and the normal Weekend Mass schedule Saturday evening and Sunday. You will have to choose Christmas Mass and a Sunday Mass to attend, as there are no two-fers.

For the Solemnity of All Saints, we will not have a vigil Mass on Sunday, but will offer 3 Masses on Monday; the normal Mass at 7:00 AM, a school Mass at 10:00 AM (open to any that would like to attend) and a 5:30 PM Mass in the evening.

"Therefore, since we have so great a cloud of witnesses surrounding us, let us also lay aside every encumbrance and the sin which so easily entangles us, and let us run with endurance the race that is set before us."

PRAYING FOR THE DEAD

The Solemnity of All Saints and the Feast of All Souls set the stage for the entire month of November. As we pray for the dead, it is good to remember the poor souls in Purgatory. We do not know which souls are in Purgatory, but we do hold this as a truth of our faith. Pope Emeritus Benedict wrote the following about Purgatory:

"If there were no purgatory, then we would have to invent it, for who would dare to say to himself that they are able to stand directly before God. And yet we don't want to be a 'pot turned out wrong that has to be thrown away; we want to be able to be put right. Purgatory basically means that God can put the pieces back together again. He can cleanse us in a way that we will be able to be with Him and stand there in the fullness of life. Purgatory creates a pure heart in each person, and we are able to see we all belong together in one enormous symphony of being"

We can, and should, pray for our beloved dead throughout the year, but with a special emphasis during the month of November. Some we might remember in a special way include our parents, youth, those that have died unexpectedly and without the sacraments, clergy (recall one of your old priests or bishop), those that have committed suicide, our separated brothers and sisters, even our enemies. Every human is a child of God, even those we find disagreeable. Asking for God's mercy upon their soul is a great personal sacrifice, but this is also one way to follow Jesus' command to love our enemies. If we forgive and show mercy, perhaps God will do so for our soul one day. It is an opportunity to see not as humans do, but as God sees. Yes, some of our loved ones may be in heaven already, but perhaps some are in need of our prayers to receive the grace to pass into heaven. We don't know, so it is good to pray for them, and entrust them to God's mercy. If they are in heaven, our prayers will be directed to another soul in need of them, and perhaps one day their intercession will lead us into heaven with them.
