FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

A BLESSED THANKSGIVING FOR ALL

This coming Thursday we celebrate Thanksgiving in the United States. Looking for some background, I came across an article by Taylor Marshall that I thought was interesting, including some trivia and pointing to some Catholic roots of this celebration.

The first recorded Thanksgiving was celebrated on September 8, 1565 in St. Augustine FL. Spanish settlers along with Native Americans celebrated this feast and the sacrifice of the Mass was offered. A similar celebration was held a few years later, in 1598 in Texas. Don Juan de Onate declared a day of Thanksgiving to be commemorated, and again, the Sacrifice of the Mass was offered.

When we begin to look at what we traditionally think of as Thanksgiving, the celebration of the Puritan Pilgrims and the Native Americans, the central figure is Squanto who negotiated between these two groups. Squanto had been enslaved by the English, but was freed by Spanish Franciscans. After being freed, he received baptism and became Catholic, and so we see a Catholic connection to the origins of this feast, even though it is seen more of a traditional protestant feast that celebrates religious toleration.

Another aspect that makes this an American Feast is that a central aspect of the early gatherings was a celebration of those that defied the Church of England and the Crown of England. It was religious persecutions that forced the Pilgrims out of England to settle in the New World. The persecutions and penal laws affected rigorous Calvinistic Puritans as well as English Catholics. The pilgrims were persecuted in the same manner as Thomas More, John Fischer, Edmund Campion and so many Catholic Martyrs of the English Reformation period.

Thanksgiving is a time to remember that, despite all the division and turmoil in our world today, we are truly a blessed nation, a nation that is beholden to our Father in heaven, and are called to be a light for justice, liberty and freedom. This will not happen with laws being imposed upon us; it will only continue through the conversion of the hearts of Americans. No matter what the particular issue of the day entails, nothing will change if our hearts are not changed. For Catholics, that begins with an honest examination of conscience and getting to confession in order to hear the words of Christ, spoken through his priests, forgiving us of our sins. We are all like the 10 lepers we are familiar with in the Gospel of Luke, calling out to Christ, seeking his mercy. After receiving his mercy, we need to ask ourselves if we are like the one that returned to give thanks, or like the 9 that took it for granted and went on their way, not changing anything in their lives.

Thanksgiving is an opportunity to look objectively at our lives, to see the blessings we have received, not only blessings that bring joy, but even those that might entail suffering in the moment and draw us into a deeper embrace of the Father. I will close with the definition of Eucharist; in Greek *Eucharistia*; to give thanks. We see that each time we celebrate the Mass, we are participating in the true Thanksgiving Meal of heaven. *Lord Jesus, Have Mercy On Us.*
