### FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

### AN ADVENT REFLECTION FROM CATHOLICEXCHANGE.COM:

Our church, God's house, is indeed a house of prayer. One question we must ask ourselves today and sincerely try to answer is this: How do we regard the church? Do we pray and worship the Lord when we are inside the church? Advent challenges us to review the things we do in the church and how we respond to the things other people do in the church. Do we use our cell phone inside the church? Do we make noise or cause distractions while attending Mass or other liturgical celebrations like baptisms and weddings? Are we brave enough to correct the misbehavior of our family members, and other people inside the church? We must observe decency in our behavior and in the way we dress up when we go to church because we are going there to meet our Lord.

Our homes can also be an expression of our faith. Is God present in our home? Or have we commercialized our domestic life? How shall we decorate our home this Advent and Christmas seasons? One suggestion is to set up an Advent wreath or a nativity scene. Put Christ in the center especially this Christmas. Wouldn't it be beautiful if all Christians, one way or another show their faith with every season?

#### THE ADVENT WREATH

Each Advent is a new beginning, a new opportunity to grow in our understanding and attain a deeper faith. We use the same symbols each year, but we are not the same, as our lives are in a constant state of flux because we change as we mature, as our families grow and decline, and the Advent wreath helps us recall this basic truth of life. In light of this, I offer again a short reflection on the Advent Wreath: this is an important means of showing our faith, and it is always good to be reminded why we do the things we do as Catholic Christians The season of Advent is celebrated in many Christian homes and churches by placing an Advent wreath in a place of honor and lighting the candles.

Oftentimes in the home this is done at dinnertime with the family, with a variety of Scripture readings and other prayers said at this time. It can be an excellent opportunity to teach younger children the meaning of this season of anticipation and deepen family devotion. Many families use other devotional items as well, such as a Jesse Tree or an Advent calendar, but the wreath plays a special part, as it can be a link between what happens in our homes and our liturgical celebrations in our churches.

While the origins of the wreath are not certain, they can be traced to pre-Christian times, where they were used as a sign of hope that soon the days would begin to grow in length. By the Middle Ages, Christians adapted this tradition as part of their preparation for the Christmas season.

The circle of the wreath is a symbol of God, with no beginning and no end, His eternity and endless mercy. The evergreen is a symbol of hope and eternal life. The candles are symbols of the light of Christ who will soon enter into the world. Each candle represents a period of waiting, symbolizing the 4 centuries from the prophet Malachi to the birth of Christ. The purple candles represent the time of prayer, penance and sacrifice leading up to Christ's birth. The pink candle represents the joy of our anticipation, as we have come to the mid-point of the Advent season. In many Advent wreaths, there is a white candle in the center of the wreath, representing Christ who is at the center of this season and our lives. This candle is lit on Christmas Eve.

If this is not a tradition in your family, perhaps consider beginning a new Advent tradition. Making use of a wreath can be a means of deepening your family's spiritual preparation for the birth of Christ, as well as help bring the family together for prayer and meals, which will help build and strengthen our families.

May God bless you and your families this Advent and Christmas seasons. Fr  $\lim$
