

### **FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK**

#### THE REAL PRESENCE IN THE EUCHARIST

At their fall meeting, the bishops of the United States offered a statement on the Eucharist and what this means for Catholic Christians. In the November 2021 issue of *Columbia Magazine* from the Knights, of Columbus, Archbishop William Lori reflects on the Real Presence. He begins by restating the study that concluded not only do many Catholics not participate regularly in the Sunday Eucharistic celebration, but there is also a declining percentage that believes in the Real Presence of the Eucharist. As Catholics, we believe that when the consecration is prayed, the elements of bread and wine are substantially changed into the body and blood, soul and divinity of Jesus Christ, and are no longer bread and wine, although they retain the outer characteristics of the these elements.

Archbishop Lori states: Restating the Church's teaching is not enough. We need to deeply reflect on the critical role the Real Presence of the Lord in the Eucharist plays in our lives. The consecration of the bread and wine is not a riddle or a magic trick, but a beautiful mystery which, when taken to heart, has the power to transform our lives.

Christ is present in the world in many ways, but in the Eucharist he uniquely gives himself as whole and entire, as food and drink, in sacrificial love. He ardently desires to unite himself with each member of his Mystical Body, which is why we use the term 'communion'. When we worthily receive the Eucharist we enter into a deep and personal union with Jesus and his Church. The Lord wishes to enter into our hearts, to make of us his dwelling place, to infiltrate and transform each and every aspect of our lives; our thoughts, decisions, relationships, work, joys and suffering.

Social occasions and gift exchanges are wonderful and even necessary traditions, but even the most valuable or thoughtful gift fails to bring us lasting happiness. The real gift we are seeking, at Christmas and throughout the year, is love. In receiving the Eucharist, we truly encounter Jesus and are changed, leading us to say with St. Paul 'It is no longer I who live, but Christ who lives in me' (Gal 2:20). As Jesus unites himself to us, he also knits fraternal bonds of charity and unity with our fellow worshippers, thus building up and strengthening the Church.

We should never take our Eucharistic Lord for granted. In the Eucharist, Christ still enters into our depths. However, if we are in mortal sin, he is not able to penetrate the barriers to his love we have raised until we receive sacramental absolution. It is also important that we spend time adoring the Lord in the Blessed Sacrament. When we take the time to adore, praise and thank Jesus Christ in the Eucharist, he fills us with grace and joy. Our gloom is dissipated and we find ourselves simply rejoicing to be in his presence, just as we do when with good friends. Christmas is all about that pure, infinite and eternal love for which our hearts are longing. For some, this gift of love seems out of reach, an event locked in the past, removed from the hardscrabble realities of our lives.

But it is not so. Just as God the Father gave the world its redeemer on that first Christmas night, so too, Jesus, our great high priest, continuously gives himself to us in the Eucharist, where we truly receive the One who loves us like no other; the One who emptied himself, became one of us, preached, healed, suffered and died, rising from the dead to defeat sin and death. In the Eucharist, we make living contact with Jesus, the gift of the Father, the gift of love and the gift of peace.

What should be our response to so great a gift? At the very least, we should participate in holy Mass every Sunday, unless we have a truly serious reason for not doing so. Not to take part in the Eucharist is like refusing to open a present from a loved one on Christmas morning.

Unthinkable! The way we "open" the gift of the Eucharist is through faith, which is itself a gift of the Holy Spirit. Faith enables us to believe in, accept and indeed welcome Jesus' gift of self in our own lives and in our parishes and communities of faith. How important that we nurture and strengthen the gift of faith we received through baptism through daily prayer and conversation with the Lord, by reading Scripture, and by regularly confessing our sins.
