ADVENT AND ST. JOSEPH

After closing the Year of St. Joseph, a year Pope Francis called to acknowledge the important role Joseph played in the Church, and the role he continues to play in our Church and in all our lives, it is important to continue reflecting on his presence in our lives. The time of Advent and Christmas are special times to reflect on St. Joseph, as this is where we find him concretely in Sacred Scripture. If we began with the words of St. Joseph recorded in the Bible, we would be finished already, as there is not one recorded word. The lack of words, however, does not lessen his impact on Jesus and Mary, nor on his impact on our lives today. He is a quiet man of action, a perfect image for our Advent, as we are actively waiting the birth of our savior. In his silence, St. Joseph teaches humility. Reading through the genealogy of Jesus in Matthew's Gospel, we find the term 'Father of so and so' again and again; but Joseph is 'Husband of Mary, of whom Jesus was born'.

Fr. Steve Grunow writes: "Saints are not celebrities, who leverage every detail about their lives as a means to be known and recognized. A saint is someone who in their desire to be like Christ is able and willing to disappear into the mission God gives to them. For some saints, this mission brings with it a great deal of attention. But for most saints, the life of grace involves a much lower profile and a death to self which requires an immersion into the most ordinary of circumstances. These circumstances are accepted by the saint because they know that it is precisely in the experience of what is apparently ordinary that God is accomplishing extraordinary things. Therefore, it is all of us, who right now find ourselves immersed in the mission to be the unnoticed saints of ordinary circumstances, who know that the silence of Saint Joseph speaks louder than any words."

In addition to his humility, St. Joseph teaches us the importance of devotion. St. Joseph was a man entirely devoted to God, lived in a special way in his devotion to his family. Pope Leo XIII called St. Joseph the "guardian of the Holy Family"—that's how devoted a spouse and father to Jesus he was. Matthew's Gospel tells us that Joseph was a "just man" (Matt 1:19), meaning he was righteous and devoted to following God's laws. As Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI put it, he was "at the service of life and growth...St. Joseph...gave proof of great devotion. For the sake of Christ he experienced persecution, exile, and the poverty which this entails. He had to settle far from his native town. His only reward was to be with Christ."

GAUDETE SUNDAY

This third Sunday of Advent is known as Gaudete Sunday, and begins the week we light the pink candle in our Advent wreaths. The term 'Gaudete' in Latin means to rejoice; and in fact it is a command to rejoice. This is important to keep in mind, as it is easy to rejoice when things are going well in our lives, but win the midst of tribulation or difficulties, whatever they may be, we are still called to rejoice at certain times, and the birth of Christ is one such time. While we remain in the days of penance of Advent, the time of completion will soon be here. It is also a time to recall we are one year closer to the Second Coming of Jesus Christ at the end of time, truly a time to rejoice.


