

ADVENT 2021

"This is how God showed his love among us: He sent his one and only Son into the world that we might live through him." (1 John 4:9)

It is hard to believe that Thanksgiving has come and gone and Christmas is less than a month away. To help us prepare our hearts for the birth of our savior, the Church gives us this special time of Advent. Without an intentional preparation Christmas can become just another season; a time of gathering with friends and family, a time of sales and parties. It can become a season that is filled with so many external activities we forget about the true meaning of the season.

We do not celebrate Christmas in order to receive gifts, but rather to receive The Gift. God, in His love for His children, sends His own Son to become man. Through him, we become adopted sons and daughters of God. The Church gives us the Advent season so we may prepare our hearts to receive this gift. Traditionally, this is a time of penance as well in the Church. The colors of the season are violet, which reflect this sentiment. It is a beautiful time to reflect upon our lives, and see how we might improve our relationship with God, His Son Jesus Christ and the Holy Spirit. It is a time to join our Blessed Mother Mary and St. Joseph as they anticipate the birth of their child.

Perhaps one of the best ways to prepare ourselves is through the Sacrament of Penance. If it has been awhile since you have received Christ's love through this sacrament, please take advantage of the sacrament this Advent season. The priests of the Marshfield deanery have set aside the afternoon of Sunday December 12th from 12:00 Noon to 5:00 PM. for the deanery Penance service. During this time there will be multiple priests available to hear confessions at OLP church. Please take advantage of this opportunity in order to prepare your hearts for all the graces God desires for you this Christmas. We will also add the second Friday of December to our confession schedule at St. John the Baptist.

May you and your families come to know God's mercy in a special way during this Advent season.

SOLEMNITY OF THE IMMACULATE CONCEPTION

This Wednesday, December 8th is the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception. We will offer a vigil Mass at 6:00 PM on Wednesday Dec 7th, and 2 Masses on Dec 8th, one at 7:00 AM and another at 10:00 AM. This is a Holy Day of Obligation, and there will be a Mass at OLP at 5:30 PM on Dec 8th for families with children in our Family Faith Program (this Mass is open to all).

The Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception is a feast of the highest order in our Church. In addition to Christmas, this solemnity retains its obligation for Catholics to attend every year, no matter which day it might fall on. For all other feasts and solemnities, when they fall on a Monday or a Saturday, the feast is celebrated, but the obligation to attend is lifted.

The Immaculate Conception is a great help for us to sit quietly with our Blessed Mother as she anticipates the physical birth of her son in Bethlehem. Many people erroneously believe this feast is a celebration of the conception of Jesus, but are mistaken. The Annunciation of the Archangel Gabriel to Mary is our celebration of the 1st moment of the Incarnation. This feast is about Mary being conceived in the womb of Anna without the stain of Original Sin. Mary was being prepared, from the moment of her conception, to become the Mother of Jesus Christ, the Son of God and Son of Man.
