ORDINARY TIME

Following the Christmas season each year, we enter into a brief period of Ordinary Time in our Church calendar. Christmas is put away, and Lent is something that we aren't guite ready to begin thinking about just yet. But Ordinary Time is anything but ordinary. In fact, time itself is not ordinary; it is a gift, created by God our Father, and given to us for our salvation. At some point, time itself will cease to exist, and we will begin to exist as we will for all eternity; either in the presence of our loving Father or separated from him. The seeds of that eternity are planted here in this life, with every choice, every action we make and every word we speak. This reality changes our approach to 'Ordinary Time'; in fact it can be the thing that calls us to a deeper sense of whom we are and who we are called to be.

As humans we celebrate special events in our lives throughout the year. Our birthdays, weddings, baptisms, anniversaries, and ordinations are all special events, but it is the life we live between these events that make them special times for us. The daily struggles and simple joys of life, lived in the day to day reality of jobs, school and family life are how we grow in our human and divine relationships. Within the Church, it is similar. Christmas and Easter are the 2 great events we celebrate each year, and we look forward to them, but we need the normal, everyday things to make them special.

We are called to live this 'Ordinary Time' in an extra-ordinary fashion, for it is central to our faith. What was the 'ordinary time' of Jesus' life? The time spent between the 1st Christmas and the 1st Easter; 30 some years living quietly in Nazareth, learning a trade as a carpenter, taking care of the family after his dad passed away, becoming more and more fully aware of who he was, God's only son. Three years of public ministry, challenging everyone he came into contact with to assess their relationship with God. This is also what we are called to do in the ordinary time of our life. Assess and reassess our relationship with the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. Where am I in this relationship; where is God calling me to be? How is my prayer life? How is my sacramental life? Am I just getting by, or am I making the effort to be the best spouse, daughter or son of God I can be? Far from ordinary.
