FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

FIRST RECONCILIATION

Every winter, we priests are blessed to be with our young boys and girls as they make their First Reconciliation in preparation for their First Holy Communion, which will be celebrated later in the spring. This is a special time for these boys and girls and for a developing and maturing in their relationship with their merciful Father. They also are growing in their love for Jesus Christ and developing a deeper appreciation for the role the Holy Spirit plays in their lives. Additionally, this sacrament is a beautiful reminder for all of us who have celebrated these sacraments, no matter if it was in the recent past or many, many years ago. Our relationship with God is never completed or finished. Just as any human relationship needs attention in order to flourish, our spiritual relationships need attention as well, and receiving these sacraments often and worthily are among the best practices to aid this relationship.

This is also a beautiful opportunity for parents to witness the importance of this sacrament to their children. A child watching mom or dad going into the confessional is a powerful statement that even mom and dad (whom we all know never do anything wrong in the eyes of a 7 year old) need the graces of the confessional, and in humility, are willing to allow their son or daughter see them going to confession.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank the teachers and catechists that helped prepare these children to receive this sacrament. Often this is an overlooked task, but we owe a great deal of thanks to those offering their time and talents in service to these boys and girls and their families. The offering of your time and talents are very much appreciated; Thank You! DIOCESAN ANNUAL APPEAL

Following the parish financial council meeting this week, it was suggested that we give an update on our Diocesan Annual Appeal. As you are aware, this annual appeal is the primary way the diocese is funded through an assessment each parish is given. Here at St. John's, due to the generosity of our families, we have historically been successful in reaching our goal.

Last year, we had 497 families participate in our appeal. This is a good number, but it is down somewhat from pre-covid numbers, when we would regularly have over 500 families participate. Doing a comparison between these numbers, we can see the difference it does make in participation. For the current year, we have pledged and received \$110,686 from 404 donors. This averages out to just under \$275 per participating family, which is less than \$25 per month going to the appeal. If the remaining 93 families pledge this average amount, we would hit our campaign goal. However, we have over 1150 registered families in our parish. If we could increase the participating families by 25, we would be over the goal by \$6,875, increasing by 50 families, we would raise an additional \$13,750. An additional positive aspect of going over the goal is that anything over is returned to the parish without being subject to any diocesan assessment (normally around 7%).

Thank your prayerfully considering participating in this appeal. Please know that no gift is too small, as in addition to the monetary gift, attached to each gift is a request for prayer for our parish and diocese. This is the true blessing of any offering we make. A successful monetary appeal that is baron of a spiritual aspect would not be a successful campaign in my eyes. Please realize that even if you are unable to make a financial gift due to particular family circumstances in the current year, you can always make a spiritual offering. Sending in an appeal response card offering prayer is very much appreciated.

Thank you for your continuing support for your parish and diocese.
