FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Lenten reflection: Fr Roman Cessario, O.P. has a short essay on the Seven Last Words of Christ, which is a popular meditation during Lent. This week, we offer his reflections for the first two words. THE FIRST WORD: I THIRST

From the wood of a cross sanctified by his blood, God's own son expresses the purpose of his becoming man. Jesus, one like us in all things but sin, thirsts for the souls of those he came to save. That is, every person on earth, beginning with Adam. Jesus wants to love us and wants us to love him in return. So he thirsts. The thirst that Jesus experiences at his death endures throughout the ages. This last word of Jesus provides a first word for every Christian. No one should begin a day without remembering before all else that Jesus thirsts for his or her soul. 'We love because he first loved us' (1 Jn 4:19). The priority of the divine initiative takes on human expression in the words of a thirsty, dying man.

THE SECOND WORD: FATHER FORGIVE THEM, THEY KNOW NOT WHAT THEY DO (Lk 23:34)

Only God can forgive sins. We hear the primordial prayer of Christian forgiveness from the lips of the crucified savior of the word. This word creates an expectation. Now, every human being is called to fulfill the command of Jesus: But to you who hear me say: love your enemies, do good to those who hate you (Lk 6:27). The only alternative to forgiveness is destruction: the end of oneself and the end of the other. Everyday occurrences throughout the world bear startling testimony to what happens when brother remains set unforgivingly against brother. To forgive characterizes the saint. We can take a first step toward this holiness by loving the heavenly Father, who makes His sun shine on the bad and the good, and who causes the rain to fall on the just and the unjust.

At the conclusion of each reflection: CLOSING PRAYER: AD JESUM PER MARIAM:

To Jesus through Mary. To learn well the divine truths that Jesus speaks to us from the cross, join the company of the Virgin Mother of God, Mary Immaculate. Let Mary open your hearts to hear whatever Jesus would tell you. As she herself instructs us: Do whatever he tells you (Jn 2:5). In the Name of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. Amen

The Pastoral Council is the principal consultative body in the parish. It plans and coordinates the overall policy of the parish in order to carry on the pastoral mission. It makes decisions. It is a model of what the parish community is or might become. It provides leadership and direction in the coordination of parish activities through its employees, committees and volunteers. This is accomplished by developing with its committees and Finance Council a "business plan" of the mission, goals, and strategies of the parish. The Pastoral Council meets five times per year. Members are elected for a two year term. A member can serve three consecutive terms and are usually involved in another parish committee facilitating communication between the council and the committees.
