#### FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

5<sup>th</sup> Word: My God, my God, why have you forsaken me? (Mt 15:34)

## We have been made sharers in the divinity of Jesus Christ, who humbled himself to share our humanity (CCC 526).

Intense sufferings accompany Jesus' acceptance of the redemptive will of his heavenly Father. These sufferings include the human cry of abandonment that crystallizes Jesus' acceptance of his death as redemptive. *My Father, if it is not possible that this cup pass without my drinking it, your will be done (Mt 26:42).* The cry of abandonment from the cross expresses a human sentiment that Jesus felt but not a reasoned conviction that he held. Like everything else the Son of God did or said, he uttered these words of abandonment for our sakes. Jesus wants us to believe that whatever dark sentiments may envelop our hearts and minds, *nothing can separate us from the love of God (Rom 8:39)* 

#### 6<sup>th</sup> Word: It is finished (Jn 19:30)

What is finished? Jesus announces that the once-and-for-all sacrifice for our sins has been completed. This sacrifice of forgiveness and reconciliation is a gift. It comes from both the Father, who so loved the world that he sent His only Begotten Son, and from the Son of God, who so loved us that he offered his life in reparation for our disobedience. This last word that Jesus speaks captures the love and obedience which he enacted throughout his whole life. Death marks the final moment of Jesus' obedience. Death, however, does not bring his love to an end. The risen and exalted Savior continues to love us: *For you who have died, and your life is hidden with Christ in God. When Christ your life appears, then you too will appear with him in glory (Col 3:3-4)* 

#### **CLOSING PRAYER**

AD JESUM PER Mariam. To Jesus through Mary. To learn well the divine truths that Jesus speaks to us from the cross, join the company of the Virgin Mother of God, Mary Immaculate. Let Mary open your hearts to hear whatever Jesus would tell you. As she herself instructs us: Do whatever he tells you (Jn 2:5).

#### LAETARE SUNDAY

This Sunday marks the Fourth Sunday of Lent, the midpoint in our Lenten observance. This comes from the first words of the introit, '*Laetare Jerusalem*' or '*Rejoice O'Jerusalem*'. This day is set aside as a day of joy in order to encourage the faithful during their Lenten penitential observances and it is interesting to note that historically, weddings were not permitted during the Lenten season with the exception of this Sunday. Rose vestments are encouraged this day and flowers can be used to decorate the altar.
