The traditional Lenten means of preparing our hearts for Easter are prayer, fasting, and alms giving. For those who will one day find their way to Heaven, these are sure, safe, and effective means of getting there. As a reminder:

Days of Fasting:

Catholics from ages 18-59 are to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Fasting means eating one full meal and two smaller meals: no snacks.

Days of Abstinence:

Catholics from age 14 years and older are to abstain from eating meat on Ash Wednesday, all Fridays in Lent and Good Friday. This obligation ends with death.

Stations of the Cross The Leaders of Prayer of St. John's will lead the Stations of the Cross on Fridays during Lent beginning on March 4^{th} at 5:30pm in the church. Everyone is invited to participate.

There is a box located in the back of church until the end of March for you to discard old palms. Since they were blessed, they should not be thrown away They will be burned and buried properly.

New Bible Study - starts on Feb. 27th: The Footprints of God DVD 9 part series by Steve Ray. This is a "fast-paced, entertaining biography, travel documentary, Bible study, [...] and Church history course rolled into one remarkable adventure." FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

GROWING IN OUR RELATIONSHIP WITH CHRIST THIS LENT

The primary point of Lent is to deepen our relationship with God, which is based on our prayer life. In order to develop our prayer life first and foremost, we need to give of ourselves and make a specific time for prayer. If we just fit it in when we can, other things will continue to come up and interfere. This Lent consider giving yourself time to be with God in prayer every day.

Weeks 1 and 2 of Lent: Reflecting on God's Infinite and Unconditional Love commit to a 15- minute prayer time for each of the three Scripture passages below, praying with one Scripture per day, in the order given. It is often helpful to use a journal or notebook to write down any inspirations received. Repeat the same process in Week Two. Begin your prayer time by asking for this specific grace: "Dear Lord, please grant me the grace of a deeper experience of Your personal love for me." You will not only come to know that God is love, but experience God's personal love for you as a unique son or daughter. Suggested Scripture for Weeks 1 and 2:

□ Luke 1:26-38 Mary's "Yes" allows the Savior to come into the world.

☐ Luke 2:1-20 God becomes man to save me.

☐ Luke 2:41-50 Jesus is eager to begin His Father's will.

From a Lenten Homily on Fasting by St. Francis De Sales

The 3 foundations of Lent are prayer, fasting and almsgiving. Following is from a homily by St. Francis de Sales on fasting:

To treat of fasting and of what is required to fast well, we must understand that of itself fasting is not a virtue. The good and the bad, Christians and pagans, observe it. The ancient philosophers observed it and recommended it. They were not virtuous for that reason, nor did they practice virtue in fasting. Fasting is a virtue only when it is accompanied by conditions which render it pleasing to God. Thus it happens that it profits some and not others because it is not undertaken by all in the same manner. Some people think that to fast well during the holy season of Lent it is enough to abstain from eating some prohibited food. We know very well that it is not enough to fast exteriorly if we do not also fast interiorly and we must accompany the fast of the body with that of the spirit.

The first condition is that we must fast with our whole heart, that is to say, willingly, whole-heartedly, universally and entirely. If I recount to you St. Bernard's words regarding fasting, you will know not only why it is instituted but also how it ought to be kept. Fasting was instituted by Our Lord as a remedy for our mouth, for our gourmandizing and for our gluttony. Sin entered the world through the mouth, the mouth must do penance by being deprived of certain foods. This glorious saint adds that as it is not our mouth alone which has sinned, but also all our other senses, our fast must be general and entire, that is, all the members of our body must fast. For if we have offended God through the eyes, the ears, the tongue or through our other senses, why should we not make them fast as well? And not only must we make the bodily senses fast, but also the soul's powers and passions — yes, even the understanding, the memory, and the will, since we have sinned through both body and spirit.

The second condition is never to fast through vanity but always through humility. According to Scripture there are hundreds and hundreds of ways to fast, but I will content myself with telling you one of them, for it is not necessary to burden your memory with many things. To fast through vanity is to fast through self-will. And what does it mean to fast through self-will? It is to fast as one wishes and not as others wish; to fast in the manner which pleases us, and not as we are ordered or counseled. You will find some who wish to fast more than is necessary, and others who do not wish to fast as much as is necessary.

What causes that except vanity and self-will? All that proceeds from ourselves seems better to us, and is much more pleasant and easy for us than what is enjoined on us by another, even though the latter is more useful and proper for our perfection. This is natural to us and is born from the great love we have for ourselves.
