#### **FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK**

The Seventh Word:

Woman, behold your son...Behold, your mother. (Jn 19:26, 27)

I will not leave you orphans; I will come to you (Jn 14:18). From the cross, Jesus fulfills the promise he made to his disciples at the Last Supper. He confides his mother Mary to the care of the beloved disciple. St. John in turn takes her into his home. This word that Jesus speaks from the cross announces Mary's unique participation in the saving work of her Son. When Mary receives John, she also embraces each one of us. We become in the order of grace her sons and daughters. Mary's maternal mediation is coextensive with the Church. No grace reaches any person on earth apart from Mary's personal love for the brothers and sisters of her only Son. This is why the saints encourage us to come to Jesus through Mary.

#### **CLOSING PRAYER**

AD JESUM PER Mariam. To Jesus through Mary. To learn well the divine truths that Jesus speaks to us from the cross, join the company of the Virgin Mother of God, Mary Immaculate. Let Mary open your hearts to hear whatever Jesus would tell you. As she herself instructs us: Do whatever he tells you (Jn 2:5).

#### **CONSECRATION OF RUSSIA TO OUR BLESSED MOTHER**

Last week we joined with our Holy Father, our bishop and many bishops across our nation and the world in offering the prayer of consecration of Russia to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. In her message to the seers, Mary said: To prevent this [World War II and the persecution of the Church and the Holy Father], I shall come to the world to ask that Russia be consecrated to my Immaculate Heart, and I shall ask that, on the first Saturday of every month, Communions of reparation be made in atonement for the sins of the world.

Cardinal Raymond Burke has written on the consecration. He writes: "As horrible as are the physical chastisements associated with man's disobedient rebellion before God, infinitely more horrible are the spiritual chastisements for they have to do with the fruit of grievous sin: eternal death." He adds, "The second part of the Secret also ends with the sure hope that the Immaculate Heart of Mary will triumph through obedience to her maternal instruction." While what we were told at Fatima is "realistic about the great evils which beset the world and the Church, it is fundamentally a message of hope in the victory of the Sacred Heart of Jesus through the Immaculate Heart of Mary. The victory of grace, however, means for us the daily conversion to Christ, purification from sin in our lives through prayer and penance, and reparation for sins committed."

In an appearance to Sr. Lucia on Dec. 10, 1925, our Blessed Mother gave details of the Five First Saturdays, and said: "Look, my daughter, at my Heart surrounded with the thorns with which ungrateful men wound it by their blasphemies and iniquities. You, at least, try to console me, and announce that I promise to assist at the hour of death, with all the graces necessary for salvation, all those who, on the first Saturdays of five consecutive months, confess, receive Holy Communion, recite part of my Rosary [meaning one set of the mysteries], and keep me company for a quarter of an hour meditating on the mysteries with the intensions of offering me reparation."

I will try to remember to put a reminder into the bulletin at the beginning of each month with this request of our Blessed Mother.

May God bless each of you and your families and loved ones.
