FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

IT'S NOT ABOUT YOU (OR ME)

How often in today's world do we get this confused? Watch almost any sporting event on television or tune in to most news shows. It is not so much the contest or the content of the show that is being promoted, but rather the individual superstar, whether that person is a sports figure or the host of the show. The focus is on 'me' rather than on the team or the issues being discussed. We saw this last weekend, with the protests going on across our country concerning the preliminary SCOTUS decision that was leaked to the press. It is as if one group thinks those that shout the loudest have the strongest argument, with personal attacks and intimidation being the order of the day rather than a debate on the facts.

Contrast this to our Blessed Mother, whom we celebrate during this month of May. Mary was visited by an angel, who told her that she had been chosen to be the Mother of God. What was her response? To run to the media of the day, promote herself as the model of womanhood? To demand that others recognize her elevated status? No, she went to serve her cousin for six months, and then return to her small hometown to resume her life, not knowing where it might lead. (We celebrate this on May 31 with the Visitation of the Blessed Virgin Mary)

Mary trusted in God. She knew that it was not about her in this life. All her gifts, all her skills, her very existence were all dependent upon God and His love for her. She placed all of this at His disposal; to do with as He pleased. There is a need for men and women today to follow this example, recognizing that our talents and abilities are gifts from God, and are to be at His disposal. If He has made me an athlete, great; if He has given me the ability to be good at business, excellent; if He has called me to the health field, give thanks; if He has called me to religious life, follow Him, Wherever God calls, using the abilities He has given you, Mary is our example; when we face surprising turns in the road we planned out, when our dreams seem to be shattered for the moment, when the unimaginable happens to us or one of our loved ones, turn to your Mother. When we live our lives in service to God through serving our neighbors, we may face suffering, but underneath it all there will be a deep sense of joy that will bring us through.

Mary, our Mother, pray for us.
