FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

HOLY COMMUNION TO THE SICK

We are hoping to expand this beyond St. John's to include volunteers from all local parishes into one program serving the hospital. INSPIRED BY THE SPIRIT

This week will be our last commitment week for the Diocesan Capital campaign *Inspired by the Spirit*. You will find response cards in the pews this week. Please bring this to prayer, and respond accordingly. Your support in all matters, especially in prayer, is very much appreciated. Remember our parish will be using these funds for some much needed parish projects as well as supporting the new Columbus school athletic and administrative center. We will give an update on the progress of this campaign as we close out the month of June. May God continue watching over the entire St. John family.

SPECIAL FEASTS

As we move back into Ordinary Time, we begin with a series of special feasts. Last Sunday we closed the Easter season with the Feast of Pentecost. This was quickly followed on Monday with a new celebration in the Church: Mary, Mother of the Church. Pope Francis has added this celebration to our calendar just a couple years ago to help remind us of the central role our Blessed Mother plays in the life of the Church, beginning with the call of Christ on the cross to his disciple: *'Behold, your Mother'*. This was then strengthened as she gathered with the disciples in the upper room when the Holy Spirit descended as tongues of fire and a strong wind.

This weekend we celebrate Holy Trinity Sunday, when we recognize the uniqueness of our Christian faith in comparison to all other faith tradition. The intimate relationship between the Father, Son and Holy Spirit plays out in our relationship with the divine as well. We do not have a God that is remote and distant, giving orders and expecting them to be blindly followed. We have a God who is closely united to our hearts and lives, even a closer, deeper relationship than we could ever have with another person. In reality, He knows us better than we even know ourselves, as He is the one that created us out of nothing, and calls us to become His sons and daughters simply because He loves us. The Trinity desires nothing more than for us to spend eternity with Him in heaven.

We follow this with the celebration of Corpus Christi, the Feast of the Body and Blood of Christ. There is a crisis in our Church today, and that crisis is the decline in belief among Catholic brothers and sisters that the bread and wine, offered up at each Mass, prayed over by a ministerial priest in Jesus' own words, truly becomes his Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity. So much of our world is based on materialism and a materialistic approach, that if we cannot measure something with human means, it simply is not true. The spiritual truths of our faith far outweigh the material aspects. There will also be a Corpus Christi Mass and procession in Rozellville Sunday afternoon.

These special feasts, as we move back into Ordinary Time, speak to the Truths we hold as Catholic Christians, and how we are to grow in the ordinary practice of our faith lives throughout the year. It is good to be aware of these beforehand, as we will be better prepared to celebrate them in a worthy manner. Looking at the Sunday readings ahead of time is a great method of preparation not only for special feasts, but for every Sunday.

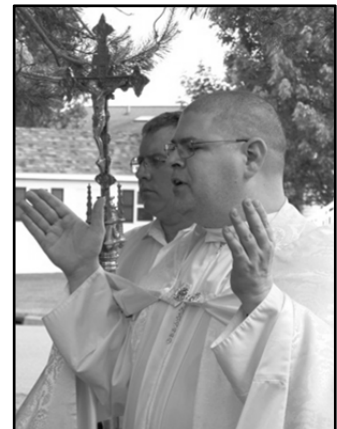

I am Fr Dan Thelen. I am entering my eighth year of priesthood, having served before as an Associate Pastor at Holy Name of Jesus and St Matthew in Wausau, St Mary's in Altoona, and St Raymond's in Brackett. I also served as chaplain at both Newman and Regis Catholic Schools. For the last four years I have been the pastor of two parishes in Alma Center and Fairchild.

I grew up in the small town of Clear Lake, west of Eau Claire. My youth was divided between farm chores, sports and faith. My parents had a small dairy operation of 100 acres and a stanchion barn with 29 stalls. I enjoyed the cattle and throughout my youth showed cattle at the fair and participated in dairy judging. Following high school, I completed a bachelor's degree at the University of Wisconsin River Falls. I then worked for about 5 years before I started seminary. I was blessed to study at both Mundelein and Rome for my theological formation. I loved these opportunities and they truly prepared me for the many challenges of ministry.

A big part of my vocation was adoration of the Blessed Sacrament so I am so very thankful that we have perpetual adoration in our parish. For the past twelve years I have also been part of a non-profit mission called Chalice of Mercy providing aid to Ukraine. Our mission is focused on protecting life from the moment of conception until natural death, providing assistance to the most impoverished hospitals, hospices and orphanages, supporting children with special needs, and helping single mothers and families. Over 2000 abortion doctors in Ukraine stopped doing abortions during the past 10 years as a result of our mission. Our very own St John the Baptist Parish was a key part of our mission's founding, a story which I will share at some point!

For those who may be confused, my last name is pronounced with a hard "T". Phonetically spelled something like this (tē/len) Throughout my priesthood I have gone by either my first or last name. You are welcome to address me in either manner. I am excited to have Fr Daniel Williams with us for the coming year. We have known each other for many years. Since both of us have the same first name, perhaps it will be easier to address us by our last names.

I am anxious and eager to connect with each of you, to bring the sacraments and the love of Christ into your lives and into your families. I have a lot to learn and I look forward to growing with you! I want to give many thanks to Fr Weighner for his dedicated leadership. Please pray for me as I enter into this new blessing in my life! I will definitely be praying for you and am eager to meet you all!
