FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

EUCHARISTIC REVIVAL

The Bishops of the United States have begun a multiyear initiative to renew the Church through renewing devotion to the Eucharist. *The National Eucharistic Revival* will include diocesan and parish based formation leading up to a National Eucharistic Congress to be held in Indianapolis in July of 2024. Bishop Andrew Cozzens of Crookston, MN is chairman of the committee on evangelization and catechesis, which is coordinating and planning events for the Revival and Congress.

The Church teaches that the Eucharist is the Source and Summit of Christian life, which is a teaching that is in need of revival. This need was highlighted with the Pew Study of September 2019 that concluded as many as 70% of Catholics do not believe or do not understand the Church's teaching of Jesus' Real Presence in the Eucharist. However, the Eucharistic Revival is more than a response to this crisis in our faith. Eucharistic Congresses are a tradition in the Church to remind us of the true value the gift of the Eucharist to the Church, and serve as opportunities for Catholics to come together to reverence the Eucharist, to come to a deeper understanding of this doctrine and to proclaim to the world our belief in Jesus' Real Presence in the Eucharist. This is also an opportunity to take part in the mission that Jesus gave the Church when he prayed we 'may all be one' (Jn 17:21), as it is the Eucharist that makes us one.

There will be a number of phases to the revival: the launch, the Diocesan Year, the Parish Year, the National Eucharistic Congress and the Year of Going out on Mission. The launch has been completed, and included the USCCB document 'The Mystery of the Eucharist in the Life of the Church', which helps any that desire to read and study this document gain a deeper appreciation for the sacrificial aspect of the Mass, what it means to live a Eucharistic life and the demands that receiving Communion makes upon me as a Christian. The USCCB is also preparing about 50 priests as National Preachers of the Revival. At the request of a parish priest, these preachers will preach at weekend Masses on the Revival and the Real Presence of the Eucharist.

The Diocesan Year began with Corpus Christi last week, and is a year that will focus on diocesan leaders that will become Eucharistic missionaries, inviting them to re-enliven their faith lives and become missionaries at the diocesan level. The Parish Year will be an opportunity to reach the people in the pews for a deeper understanding of this aspect of our faith or even to introduce this to the people that are at Mass on any given Sunday. The Parish Year concludes with the Eucharistic Congress in Indianapolis, running from July 17 – 21, 2024. Catholics from across the country will join together in what is hoped to be a spiritual moment that impacts the entire nation.

Following is the year of being sent; a missionary year to reach non-practicing Catholics and non-Catholics, to introduce them or re-introduce them, to the beauty of the Source and Summit of the Catholic Mass, the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist, and an invitation to experience this relationship Christ desires to have with all men and women in the world.

Please keep this revival in your prayer, especially at adoration.




