#### FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

#### INVITATION TO RETURN TO MASS

There is a phenomena we are facing in our world today. Although I am not positive of the cause, it is not limited to St John the Baptist or even the Catholic Church in our nation. It is something that goes beyond us as Catholic Christians and has impacted our brothers and sisters in most other faith traditions. It was brought to the forefront through how we and others responded to the Covid crisis. The issue is how do we reconnect with parishioners that no longer deem it necessary to attend Masses or other services in-person on a regular basis? I have spoken with a number of priests and other ministers about this, and it seems to be one of the most concerning topics we face as a group.

In the midst of the crisis, people were told, in effect, 'your faith, your parish life, is not necessarily a priority'. In other words, this is not an essential aspect of life in our world today. To some degree or another, this is the message that was sent out through parish life, through pastors and ministers, even through our bishops, all the way up to the pope himself. Closing church buildings, closing off the Vatican, even, limiting our freedom to gather as we desire, streaming services rather than in-person services or offering other video or multi-media opportunities as replacements for being present to each other. Perhaps we were able to withstand this somewhat better than our brothers and sisters as being a sacramental church requires a physical presence. The Church is not a Pez distributor of grace. We cannot receive absolution without presenting ourselves, we cannot receive Christ in the Eucharist without being physically present for the Mass, and baptisms require a physical presence of the recipient and minister. This can go on for each sacrament, but you get the picture.

All this adds up to a relational crisis. We need to ask ourselves, how does a relationship flourish if one party turns away? Or perhaps, many believe that watching the TV Mass is enough. I grant it is convenient, but I do not believe it is enough. Some believe that they are fine, until a crisis hits their life. Some may not be aware of the many issues this remote approach to life, including our relationships with each other and with God, can bring, but I believe it damages us in ways we cannot begin to imagine. It causes isolation and loneliness; it separates us from God and neighbor, it can pit us against each other at times as well. In fact, I believe this is a driving force to the violence we face is so many of our communities throughout our nation. If a person believes they are all alone and no one cares for them, it is easy to see how they can find themselves suffering from depression. They then act out on this as if life is a video game, and they attack those they hold responsible. They have a weak relationship with family, their relationship with people at work or school are non-existent and they feel abandoned by God; and this adds up to a situation in which they see only one way to escape, and that is through violence.

One way we can begin to respond is to take a look around us and see if there is a way we can help another reconnect. Perhaps offer an invitation to a family member or co-worker we have not seen at Mass for a time. Offering to bring them if they are in need might be appreciated. Just reaching out and touching base might be the one thing they need in the moment, to realize someone has noticed they are not present, and are missed. There are a number of other ways to reach out; think outside the box. Consider, if each family in attendance on any given weekend is able to help one family return in the coming months, what a blessing it would be to our parish, and what a blessing in their life.
