FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

This week is a busy week with around fifty children of our parish participating in Vacation Bible School. Also all the Confirmation students are heading off for a daylong retreat on Wednesday. Please pray for our youth that they may come to know, love and deepen their relationship with Jesus.

Peace is an incredible gift. Peace is the fruit of forgiveness. Through the humble act of forgiveness, we return peace to our relationships both on earth with one-another and with God in heaven.

Jesus Christ, himself, is the Prince of Peace. This title of Jesus comes from the prophecy of Isaiah: "They name him Wonder-Counselor, God-Hero, Father-Forever, Prince of Peace." The peace of Christ brings healing and order, overturning the division and brokenness caused by sin.

The Gospel of John Chapter 20 offers perhaps the most striking example of peace. Jesus has just risen from the dead. He appears to the apostles and says, "Peace be with you." It is interesting to note that only a bishop can say the words "Peace be with you." at the greeting at the start of Mass. A bishop has the fullness of Holy Orders; therefore, in his office he most perfectly represents Christ. A priest can say several greetings including, 'The Lord be with you'; However, it is only a bishop that can say "Peace be with you."

This peace proclaimed by Jesus in John 20 is extended through the apostles to universal church. It is this peace that marks the kingdom of Christ's reign. It is significant to note that John 20 offers also the origin of the Sacrament of Confession (John 20:21). One day I will explain this significant passage more deeply in a homily, but in John 20:21 Jesus breathes on the apostles (hearkening back to the story of Adam and Eve). Instead of giving physical life, as he did with Adam, the breath of Jesus in John 20:21 gives the renewal of the spiritual life through the forgiveness of sins. Thus, it is in this verse that we see the origin of the utterly beautiful Sacrament of Confession. Holy Confession redeems the soul. This passage in John 20 reveals that what God did at the creation of the first man, he now redeems in and through his Son.

Returning to Mass, it is the sign of peace offered at the Mass that is a true extension of this scene in John 20. It is the priest, in persona Christi, who from the altar offers the peace of Christ. This peace of Christ is then extended to the congregation. Thus, the sign of peace at Mass exchanged between parishioners, is not a mere meet-and-greet. Rather it is an extension of the peace offered by Jesus in Chapter 20, now re-presented at every Holy Mass, a peace that conquers the division of sin with the fullness of God's love. ~ Blessings to each of you this coming week.

May St. John the Baptist pray for us.
