#### FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

The Gospel today describes a man whose land produced a bountiful harvest. It was so abundant that he decided to tear down all his old barns and build bigger barns. The man had big plans for his future. Little did he know that his life would end that very night. This Gospel reading reminds us of our own mortality.

A priest once told me that we are just a breath away from death. If we do not take our next breath, we will soon expire. This reality scared me to my core in my early twenties when 9/11 happened. On this fateful day, I realized that life is fleeting. It was terrifying to think of death. I believe we all experience at some point the scary reality of our death. We can procrastinate about many things, but eventually we will all one day meet our end.


St. Paul reminds us that "we hold our treasure in earthen vessels." (2 Cor 4:7) The man in this weekend's Gospel treasured the abundance of his harvest. He invested all his time in the construction of new barns. His treasure was his harvest and it was taken away from him with his death. As Christians we give God thanks for the blessings that come, but these worldly blessings are not our ultimate treasures. The greatest treasure we have is our faith. St. Paul reminds us that "our body is a temple of the Holy Spirit." (1 Cor 6:19) This is the treasure that we hold in earthen vessels, the Holy Spirit. Our body is frail. It will suffer and age. As Christians we are called to live for what will eternally endure. We are called to live for our faith and to see our faith as our ultimate treasure.

I remember when I was much younger pondering the question of what to do with my life. I had many interests and with each interest I considered what would become of my life if I pursued that interest with the fullness of my life. I recognized that living for the world "building bigger barns" was vanity. If one places their treasure in the world, something will ultimately go wrong, leading to potential despair. However, if one lives for God, then difficulty is always buoyed by the promise of the Gospel. The hope of the Gospel is the surest foundation upon which to build one's life. ~ Blessings to each of you this coming week.

May St. John the Baptist pray for us.
