FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

One of the most unique titles of Jesus is from the Gospel of John where Jesus says, "I am the gate." (Jn 10:9) We probably all have stories of gates in our lives. Whether it is a gate to keep your pet in a kennel, your infant child away from stairs, or gates on a farm. All gates serve to protect and save one from danger. Jesus is the gate. He protects us and leads us to true life. This succinct and profound title of Jesus is expressed most fully in Jesus' words, "I am the way, the truth, and the life." (Jn 14:6)

St. Peter proclaims in the Acts of the Apostles, "There is no salvation through anyone else, nor is there any other name under heaven given to the human race by which we are to be saved." (Acts 4:12) As Catholics we know that it is only through Jesus that we will find salvation. He is the gate that leads to true life.

Our Gospel this weekend says, "Strive to enter through the narrow gate, for many, I tell you, will attempt to enter but will not be strong enough." (Lk 13:24) Our Lord warns us to take our faith seriously. He has given us many years as an opportunity to choose Him. Do not delay. Do not postpone your conversion. Do not let anything keep you from reconciling your life with God. Jesus is the only way. We must strive to enter through the narrow gate.

The word gate appears in another very famous Bible passage. Jesus says, "I say to you, you are Peter, and upon this rock I will build my church, and the gates of Hell shall not prevail against it." (Jn 16:18) According to this passage, when we remain in the Church, we remain protected. The gates of Hell will not prevail against us.

Gates have another very strong symbol. Gates do not move. Rather we have to move to the gate. Therefore, what will you do with your life. Will you move to the Gate of Life? Will you seek Jesus in the sacraments, in prayer, in adoration, in penance? Will you pursue Jesus and enter into the fullness of life? Or will you move to the Gate of Death? Are you becoming complacent and insincere in your faith? Are you resisting the call of Jesus and finding yourself in a life of sin? One Holy Confession can set you free! You have a choice. Gates do not move. We move. Choose to move to the gate that is Jesus. Choose the narrow way and enter into the fullness of the life of Jesus. ~ Blessings to each of you this coming week.
