FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Next Sunday afternoon is our parish picnic. This will be a wonderful way for our community to come together and share time with one another. It is often the case that families move into the area and have a tough time connecting with others. Opportunities such as this picnic provide the special moments for new friendships to form with like-minded faithful Christians. Please feel free to introduce yourself to others next Sunday at our picnic.

As noted, the rectory garage was taken down last week. It had many structural issues and needed to be replaced. A new garage, matching the architectural style of our parish campus, will be constructed this Fall. Thank you for all your support in this process.

Our readings this weekend provide a number of important insights. I would like to focus on one in particular. Abraham was a man of faith. Because of his faith Abraham was obedient to God. This obedience led to the blessings he received. Obedience remains central in our walk with Jesus. The word obedience literally means to 'give ear to what is being said'. True Christian obedience is marked by trust. Obedience is not blind. True obedience is an assent of the intellect to truth and the humble movement of the will to follow that truth.

Apostolic succession is the guarantee that the Church maintains with fidelity the teachings of Jesus. As Catholics we remain connected to the uninterrupted passage of truth from Jesus to the apostles to their successors down to our own time. This is apostolic succession. By remaining in obedience to the Church, we remain connected to the source of truth that is Jesus Christ. Thus, Jesus says, "I say to you, you are Peter, and upon this rock I will build my church, and the gates of the netherworld shall not prevail against it." (Matt 16:18)

Obedience is the hallmark of a faithful Christian. Authentic obedience is never in opposition to either our intellect or our freedom. Rather the unbroken chain of apostolic succession and the guiding presence of the Holy Spirit make manifest the truth of Christ in and through the Church. The Church is full of sinners, but the Church itself is a Divine institution guided by the Holy Spirit in proclaiming the truth of Christ. In his Last Supper discourses Jesus promises that the Holy Spirit will be with us always. He says, "I will ask the Father, and he will give you another Advocate, the Holy Spirit, to be with you always." (Jn 14:16) and "the Spirit of truth, the Holy Spirit, will guide you to all truth." (Jn 16:13) ~ Blessings to each of you this coming week.

May St. John the Baptist pray for us.
