FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

This Sunday's first reading from the Book of Wisdom compares our knowledge of the earth to our knowledge of God. The Book of Wisdom says, "Scarce do we guess the things on earth, and what is within our grasp we find with difficulty."

Consider the many faithful Catholics who have studied the natural world. Take for instance, Louis Pasteur, the chemist who founded the process of pasteurization. He was a faithful lay man. He died with his rosary in hand and had placed on his tomb the words, "Everything grows clear in the reflections from the Infinite." Or consider the father of genetics, the priest Fr. Gregor Mendel, who lived his life as an Augustinian friar.

More recently, Mother Eugenia Elisabetta Ravasio, a native of Italy, was instrumental in the cure of leprosy. She received only an elementary education. During her life as a nun, she opened over 70 medical centers - each with an infirmary, school and church - in the remotest spots of Africa, Asia and Europe. As part of her work with lepers on the lvory Coast she was instrumental in promoting and popularizing a cure of leprosy, by orally administering chaulmoogra oil which was extracted from the seed of a tropical plant.

"Scarce do we guess the things on earth...but when things are in heaven, who can search them out?" With great difficulty, humankind is able to grasp the things of the earth. Whether that be the cure of leprosy or modern inventions such as wireless communications. Each of these advances are possible but only at the cost of great diligence and great study. The things of heaven, however, are unreachable for us. Only with the Holy Spirit can we understand the things of God.

Thus, the Book of Wisdom in this Sunday's reading says, "Except you have given wisdom and sent your holy spirit from on high." It is God who gives wisdom. It is God who sends the Holy Spirit. We need only to make ourselves receptive to these utterly good gifts from God. We do this through prayer, through penance, through obedience to God's commands. Louis Pasteur, Fr. Gregor Mendel, Mother Eugenia and the many other holy men and women who blessed us with their knowledge unlocking the gifts of God's creation. These were all great accomplishments. But it was wisdom and the Holy Spirit, the truly good gifts sent by God from on High, that these holy men and women sought above all else. "Ever since the creation of the world, his invisible attributes of eternal power and divinity have been able to be understood and perceived in what he has made." (Romans 1:20) ~ Blessings to each of you this coming week.

May St. John the Baptist pray for us.
