FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

This weekend Fr. Joseph Hirsch of Casa Hogar will be at all of our Masses. He was my vocation director when I first entered seminary, so it is a joy to have him here at St. John's! Casa Hogar is a home for youth in Peru with the mission of delivering high quality care in a family environment. There are 64 children and 8 families who live at Casa Hogar ranging in age from 5 years to 17 years. Their care is unique from the traditional orphanage model. Over the years, their organization has provided many children with a safe and caring environment where they gain the confidence to develop skills that empower and enable them for a more promising future.

As the central hub for an association of 19 orphanages and local service homes, Casa Hogar aims to impact the community beyond just their children. Through a global network of volunteers, support and love from around the world, their goal is to engage, integrate and uplift the local community while allowing their children not only to survive, but to thrive.

Casa Hogar was founded on March 22, 1986. It all started with the dream of Fr. Joe Walijewski, a missionary priest from the Diocese of La Crosse. Fr. Joe came to Peru in 1971 and spent almost two decades in the parish that he founded. In 1978 and 1985 Fr. Joe had the opportunity to speak with Pope John Paul II and tell him about his dream of building a home for poor and abandoned children. The Pope, impressed with Fr. Joe's commitment and enthusiasm, donated \$50,000 which was used to begin the initial structure of the home which now bears his name. Fr. Joe then moved to Lurín to start Casa Hogar. Fr. Joe found his inspiration after seeing how so many of Lima's children live in desperate poverty. One day, while walking through the slums of Lima, he noticed what appeared to be a pile of old newspapers begin to move. Then, the heads of a little girl and boy popped out. These children, like so many street kids of Lima, had spent the night with only the newspapers to protect them from the cold. He thought to himself, "How can I go home to a warm bed, when so many children are living in these conditions?"

This last weekend a young student of ours in the Columbus school system had a major injury to his head. Last Sunday evening over 200 of us gathered for a prayer service, Rosary and a candlelight vigil. The following day all of the Columbus students and faculty gathered again to pray. We asked for the intercession of Our Lady. We also asked for the intercession of Fr. Joe Walijewski. Fr. Joe gave his life in service to children, I encourage you also to ask for Fr. Joe Walijewski's intercession. Our young student needs a miracle and so does Fr. Joe Walijewski (for his Beatification) ~ Blessings to each of you this coming week.

May St. John the Baptist pray for us.
