#### FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Often my friends from previous assignments will ask how things are going at St. John's. In my response, I always bring up how amazed I am by how much activity happens here on our little block. Every day 250 kids come here to our school. At morning drop-off and evening pick-up our streets are filled with cars. Every day too about 80 people come for the 7am daily Mass preceded by Rosary and prayer. Our adoration chapel is visited non-stop 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. Catechesis of the Good Shepard provides formation for children in the room adjacent to the adoration chapel. Our offices in the rectory are visited throughout the day by parishioners and the Columbia room is used throughout the week for meetings and fellowship. We have just one little block, and yet so much happens here. It is a blessing.

It is good to be reminded of how fortunate we are to have such an active parish. Since I live here, I see all this activity. This past week we had grandparents' day for our children. Thus, on both Tuesday and Wednesday our church was full of our students and their grandparents. It was a great way to see the passing on of the faith to our future generations. Looking back to my own grandparents I don't remember much of what they said, but I do remember that my grandparents on my Dad's side always went to Mass when we visited. I also remember that faith was part of their home. One unique holy image on their wall would change in appearance when you moved from side to side. I don't remember what the image depicted but I remember that it was sacred. Each of these touchpoints seeded the faith in my own heart. May you know that your own witness of the faith is also blessing the future generations.

Our little block is a sacred space. I am very thankful that it is so very active. I encourage you to continue to remain steadfast in your commitment to prayer to keep our block a center of faith. I also encourage you to strive to answer God's call. What is it that the Lord is calling you to do to share the faith? What can you do to keep the faith here at St. John's alive and strong? Can you offer more time to visit for prayer, to sign up for an hour of adoration, to join a small group, or even to start a small group to share the faith and build holy relationships? ~ Blessings to each of you this coming week.
