The holiness of every saint is a direct result of Christ acting in their life, and the saint's willingness to trust in Jesus.

On this earth we live in pilgrimage. St. Paul says, "We groan within ourselves as we wait for adoption, the redemption of our bodies." and "I consider that the sufferings of this present time are as nothing compared with the glory to be revealed for us." I want to thank you for your continued generosity in supporting the capital campaign for our parish. Several of our parishioners will be giving an update on our campaign at this weekend's Masses. The following is a brief summary of the campaign.

- At St. John the Baptish we are currently at 63% of our goal.
- Since we have met our Diocesan Annual Appeal for this year, everything pledged going forward will be distributed at an 80:20 split; 80% returning to our parish in the following ways.
- Up to \$500,000 will be used to support the Fieldhouse Expansion Project at Columbus.
- \$200,000 towards the construction of a new garage.
- \$60,000 to the resurfacing of our Parking Lot.

Thank you for your generosity. Please pray on how you can support our parish through the campaign. ~ Blessings to each of you this coming week.


