The contractor hopes to have a new speaker installed around mid-December. Once this is installed, the sound system should be back to good order. Secondly, the concrete for the garage is finished. John Altmann Builders hopes to start the actual construction of the garage in early December. Finally, after a year of delay we are finally getting a new piano for our choir loft.
