The Reverend **Keith J. Kitzhaber**, Pastor of St. Sacred Heart Parish in Marshfield and Corpus Christi Parish in Bakerville, has requested a temporary leave of absence for reasons of personal health and well being, and it has been accepted, effective December 12, 2022.

After January 1, no priests are available to take Father's place during his absence. In the meantime, area Mass and Confession schedules will need to be modified in order to best serve the parishioners of Sacred Heart and Corpus Christi while at the same time creatively utilizing our existing deanery priest personnel. Beginning Saturday and Sunday, January 7 and 8, Father Saylor from Christ the King in Spencer will offer a 6:00pm Saturday Mass at Corpus Christi. Father Robertson from Our Lady of Peace will offer an 8:00am Sunday Mass at Sacred Heart. The 8:00am Sunday Mass at Our Lady of Peace will be suspended to facilitate this. The 6:00pm Sunday Mass at Sacred Heart will also be suspended after this weekend. Confessions on the third Friday of each month will be moved from St. John the Baptist to Sacred Heart. Funerals at Corpus Christi will be celebrated by Father Saylor and at Sacred Heart by Father Robertson. Suggested alternatives for Saturday evening Mass are 4:00pm at Our Lady of Peace; 4:30pm at St. John the Baptist; 5:00pm at St. Michael in Hewitt.


