FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Recently I had a parishioner ask me to share a bit about the liturgy and some of the changes I have incorporated at our Sunday worship. So much of the Mass comes directly from the Bible. We sing the Gloria at the beginning of Mass since angels announced the birth of Christ singing "Glory to God in the highest and on earth peace to those on whom his favor rests." (Lk 2:14) Similarly we sing Holy, Holy, Holy because this is the song that Isaiah witnessed when he saw the Seraphim in heavenly worship (Isaiah 6:3)

Scott Hahn in his work *The Lamb's Supper* highlights the many ways that the final book of the Bible, the Book of Revelation, with all its symbolic language of the end times, is actually a powerful description of the Holy Mass in the early church.

- The servers carrying lighted candles during the entrance procession and then also at the time of the Proclamation of the Gospel. (Rev 1:13; 4:5).
- A single book is used in the Procession to the Ambo for the Proclamation of the Gospel. (Rev 5:1-8)
- Scripture is chanted throughout the Mass. (5:9,11-12) This chanting is done in dialogue. Thus, as the priest and the congregation chant in response to one another, the chant is imaging the spousal exchange of love between Jesus and the Church.
- The pattens at the time of Communion serve a dual purpose. Of practical concern, they catch fragments of the host before these particles fall to the ground. They, along with the chalices, the ciborium and the entire sanctuary, also communicate the glory of heaven. (Rev 21: 11-21)

It is interesting to note also that Jesus himself dresses in a way similar to priests during the liturgy. In St. John's vision Jesus is seen wearing a long robe with a golden sash covering his chest. (Rev 1:12-13). Every priest wears the same sash, called a stole, under the outer chasuble. The stole and chasuble always match the color of the day. The following is a rather lengthy web address. However, it provides a great table demonstrating nearly all the parts of Holy Mass hidden in the Book of Revelation.

joy-filled holiness in the service of the Church and world. Pray also for many more laborers to enter the vineyard so that Jesus Christ may be better known, experienced and loved.


Eucharistic Revival: A Minute with Jesus
