Natural Family Planning: NFP is cost effective. While the initial cost to learn NFP may vary, the long term costs are actually quite inexpensive. NFP is a blessing for Marriage. Couples who use NFP frequently report increased communication, empathy, trust, and marital satisfaction.

An in-person 3-part SymptoPro Natural Family Planning course will be offered in the Marshfield Deanery at St. John the Baptist Marshfield from 1pm-4pm Sunday, Jan. 22, Feb. 5, and Feb. 19. Cost is \$100. If you have taken this course in the past and have the Couple's Guide to Fertility book, the fee will be waived. FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Blessed Feast of the Epiphany! The word Epiphany refers to the "manifestation" of Jesus during three particular biblical events. Pope Benedict XVI, whose funeral was this past week, refers to this tradition in a homily on Epiphany in 2009. He says, "Epiphany, the 'manifestation' of Our Lord Jesus Christ, is a many-faceted mystery. The Latin tradition identifies it with the visit of the Magi to the Infant Jesus in Bethlehem and thus interprets it above all as a revelation of the Messiah of Israel to the Gentiles. The Eastern tradition on the other hand gives priority to the moment of Jesus' baptism in the River Jordan when he manifested himself as the Only-Begotten Son of the heavenly Father, consecrated by the Holy Spirit. John's Gospel, however, also invites us to consider as an 'epiphany' the Wedding at Cana, during which, by changing the water into wine, Jesus 'manifested his glory; and his disciples believed in him' (Jn 2:11)."

Epiphany (originally observed on January 6 in the Roman Rite), is one of the oldest liturgical celebrations. Traditionally, this is the time also for the blessing of homes. Blessed chalk will be available today in the church if you would like to mark your front entrance in the traditional manner. Take the blessed chalk and write the following over the top of your front entrance.

20 C+M+B 23

The letters stand for the traditional names of the wisemen Caspar, Melchior, and Balthasar. It is also popularly believed that the initials stand for "Christus mansionem benedicat" ("Christ bless this house").

This weekend a half-sheet of paper will be in your pews to update your parish records. We hope to make sure our records are accurate. Secondly, we wish to create a proactive group in our parish that can assist in responding quickly to moments of need. Thus, when updating your information, you will also be able to contribute ways you may wish to help our parish or a situation of need.

My prayers are with you during this last weekend of the Christmas season. I truly want to thank all who have provided so much beauty to our church during this holy season. All who decorated the church, those who filled our church with music, and all others who helped in any way. Christ has come and we are in joy!! Blessings to each of you this holy season.
