FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

This coming Wednesday is the Feast of the Conversion of St. Paul. The life of St. Paul is characterized by prayer and preaching. Saint Paul was driven by a passion for preaching and was always on the move, announcing Jesus Christ to the world. This passion for preaching was fueled by St. Paul's profound encounter with Christ. Even before his conversion, he was a man of great dedication to God. His conversion on the road to Damascus intensified this zeal and led him to know Jesus Christ. It was at this time that he heard the voice of Jesus. He then spent three years in silence in Arabia and describes being caught up into the third heaven, providing him an experience of God that exceeded explanation.

St. Paul was a man of action. However, his action sprung from his encounter with Christ. His action was not of his own doing. This is critical to understand. His action did not flow from himself, it flowed from his encounter with Jesus Christ, an encounter he renewed daily through sacrifice, prayer and obedience. He lived as a man fully alive in Christ. He says, "None of us lives for oneself...For if we live, we live for the Lord, and if we die, we die for the Lord; so then, whether we live or die, we are the Lord's." (Rom 14:7-8) St. Paul loved God with the greatest intensity and it manifested itself through his incredible preaching.

May we too be given the grace to seeking and encountering the Lord in all that we do. Jesus says in the Gospel, "Go into the whole world and proclaim the Gospel to every creature. Whoever believes and is baptized will be saved; whoever does not believe will be condemned." (Mark 16:15)

Are you zealous in witnessing the Gospel? Do your friends, family and co-workers know you are a Christian? The Gospel must always be preached with love. But it should be preached. Too often we do not pray and we do not make sacrifices for the Lord, and therefore we do not preach. And as a result, our faith becomes lukewarm. Our faith grows cold and we do not witness to Jesus with our lives. Resist this. Dedicate your life for the sake of the Gospel. Offer your life for the sake of the Gospel. Blessings to each of you.

May St. John the Baptist and St. Paul pray for us. Fr. Thelen



What Are You Looking For?

The first question that Jesus asks in John's Gospel is, "What are you looking for?" He is speaking to John's disciples as they follow after Him, desiring to know who Jesus is and what His mission is all about. After the disciples respond, Jesus gives them an instruction, "Come and you will see!" Whether we can hear it or not, that same question is being asked to you. What are YOU looking for? So often, we find ourselves searching, not knowing exactly where to go or what to do in life. We seek things that will hopefully fill the emptiness and longing that we have in our hearts, but nothing seems to satisfy. The real answer to this can be found in Jesus' response as He invites each of us to follow after Him, to get to know Him, and to follow the path He has placed before us. For some men, that path is a very special invitation to walk in Jesus' footsteps as a priest.
