FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

The most recent copy of the Parish Council minutes can be found in the back of the church. Highlighted in these minutes are a few projects. The garage is near completion, the side chapel of the church is getting some updates including fresh paint and a new ceiling, and plans are being developed for some designated parking spaces near the adoration chapel. Also we are starting a few subcommittees focusing on social justice and family activities. Finally, a series of talks is being offered in February and March. Thank you for all your assistance in making our parish a special place.

Recently we celebrated the feast of Saint Thomas Aquinas. It reminded me of the significant influence St. Thomas had upon my seminarian formation. I was blessed during my studies to study at a university that he in part founded and to visit the castle where he was born along with the monastery where he died. Likewise, I visited some of the churches in Naples and Orvieto where he served.

St. Thomas Aquinas was born in 1225 to a wealthy Italian family. At age five, he was sent to study at Monte Cassino, the abbey founded by St. Benedict. At the age of ten he entered the University of Naples, where he learned philosophy and rhetoric. As a young man St. Thomas Aquinas desired to become a Dominican priest. His parents, however, opposed this plan because Dominicans, like Franciscans, embraced poverty. The family wanted the young St. Thomas to choose a path that would enhance their family power. The family was so opposed to St. Thomas Aquinas' plan to join the lowly Dominicans, that they actually locked him up for several months in their family castle and then tried to corrupt him by allowing a prostitute to enter his room. St. Thomas Aquinas' immediately chased her out with a smoldering log.

Eventually the family allowed him to escape from captivity. He traveled to Rome, received the Pope's blessing, and then soon departed for Paris to study under St. Albert the Great. By the time he was 23, St. Thomas was teaching alongside his mentor at the university of Cologne. Around the middle of the century St. Thomas was ordained to the priesthood. St. Thomas' best-known achievements were his expansive writings, in particular the Summa Theologica.

St. Thomas Aquinas died on March 7, 1274. He was canonized in 1323, and made a Doctor of the Church in 1567. In 1965, the Second Vatican Council taught that seminarians should learn "under the guidance of St. Thomas," in order to "illumine the mysteries of salvation as completely as possible."



How does God speak to me?

Have you ever wondered how God may be speaking to you? Perhaps you are waiting to hear a loud, booming voice come from the heavens to tell you what to do or which way to go. While this isn't completely out of the question, often God takes a much subtler approach. In 1 Kings, we have the account of the Prophet Elijah standing at the entrance of a cave, waiting for the Lord to appear. As he waits, he encounters a strong, violent wind, a powerful earthquake and a consuming fire, yet God was not revealing Himself in any of those powerful examples. Finally, as Elijah waited, he heard a soft, quiet whisper. At that, he knelt to the ground and prayed. God often speaks to us, not in grand and impressive ways, but in the silence. When we can still our hearts, that's when we begin to hear His voice, calling us into relationship and to follow Him. Sometimes that invitation is to follow the Lord as one who lovingly serves others in the priesthood.
