#### FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

We are so blessed to have Catholic schools in our community. As of late our enrollment increases each year, which is a wonderful gift. David Eaton, the President of our Catholic school system, has given me the goal of getting (10) new students to join our system this coming year. I hope you can join me in making this a reality.

The Catholic schools operate from several income streams: tuition, vouchers, parish subsidies and fundraising. Due to the current voucher program, every family in the Marshfield area has the opportunity to attend Columbus Catholic Schools. The voucher program allows parents to receive a tuition voucher to enroll their children in approved private and religious schools. The tuition voucher means that there is no personal tuition expense for qualifying families to attend Columbus Catholic Schools. The program is limited to those families with incomes equal or below 220% of the federal poverty level. (The income levels are listed on the Columbus website or provided by phone when calling the school.)

If that inner voice has been moving you to consider Catholic Schools, please strongly consider checking out the opportunities that are present. The voucher application period is February 1<sup>st</sup> through April 20<sup>th</sup>. Students attending a public school or being homeschooled can enter any grade and receive a voucher if they qualify.

I would also like to give you a reminder about the Shadow Day at Columbus on Monday, February 20<sup>th</sup>. This is an opportunity for a prospective student who will be entering grades 3 through 12 in the fall to spend an entire day at OLP or Columbus. The students are paired with one of the Columbus students and follow their schedule for the entire day. Visiting students can request to shadow a specific Columbus student if they have a friend in the same grade. Parents can learn more, and sign up for Shadow Day, by visiting the Columbus website.

Untold graces are available at every Holy Mass.
