#### FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Dear Parishioners: We are entering into the celebration of the greatest mysteries of our Faith. The Passion, Death and Resurrection of our Lord, Jesus Christ. The word 'Mass' is an interesting word and at first glance it really doesn't seem to make sense. Thus, we could ask, why do we call our worship of God on Sunday, Mass?

The English word "Mass" comes from the Latin word Missa, which means to be "sent." The word is used during the conclusion of the celebration, when the priest or deacon says in Latin, 'Ite, Missa Est'. The literal translation of that phrase is, "Go, it is sent." Saint Thomas Aquinas wrote a commentary on these words and explained in his Summa Theologiae, "And from this the Mass derives its name ... the deacon on festival days 'dismisses' the people at the end of the Mass, by saying: 'Ite, Missa Est,' that is, the victim [Jesus] has been sent to God through the angel, so that it may be accepted by God."

During Mass, I as a priest have a number of prayers to select from during the consecration of the Eucharist. At times I use the First Eucharistic Prayer. In this prayer I ask the Father, "command that these gifts be borne by the hands of your holy Angel to your altar on high." Thus, at every Holy Mass, not only are we re-presenting the sacrifice of Christ, but we are also offering the Son to the Father. This perfect offering becomes the perfect expiation for our sins. Thus, the literal definition of the word 'Mass' is the offering of Jesus to the Father. It is the sending of Jesus to the Father.

In modern times the Mass has also taken on the meaning of mission, for the English word 'mission' also finds its origin in the Latin word, missa. During the Mass, we have heard the word of God and received the Sacrament. At the conclusion of Mass, we are sent on mission to bring Jesus to the world.

As we enter into Holy Week, may we enter more deeply into the prayer of the Church. May our daily lives be colored by the events of Jesus' Passion, Death and Resurrection. If we can do this, we will more deeply understand how 'Mass' is both the offering of Jesus to the Father and us being sent into the world on mission.

May St. John the Baptist pray for us.

#### **EUCHARISTIC REVIVAL**



**Tenebrae Service**: On Good Friday at 8pm, we will have a Tenebrae service celebrated in our parish. Last year was the first year we have offered it and it is a profound service to experience. Tenebrae is Latin for darkness or shadows. The Tenebrae service, which dates from the middle ages, recreates the emotional aspects of the Passion. With the singing or recitation of each psalm or scripture readings, candles are extinguished on the altar to remember the darkness of the burial of Jesus and the closing of the tomb. At the end of the service, the final candle is taken from the altar and processed into the sacristy so that the church becomes very dark signifying the Light of the World departing the earth. This is when the loud banging and noise from the organ expresses the tumult of heaven and the chaos of the world without its Savior. Everyone departs in silence afterwards. This year we are introducing some musical aspects with the organ and the expertise of some of our choir members. I highly encourage everyone to attend. If you wish to use a pen light to read the program, you are welcome to bring them, but respecting the reality of the darkness is important as well.
